## NAVY RECRUITING TRIP LEAVE FRIDAY

### Governor and Officials Aid in Getting Men for Super-dreadnaught.

The navy recruiting train, which is touring the state for recruits for the super-dreadnaught Tennessee, will be in Memphis Friday. Gov. H. H. Lehman, Harvey H. H. Lehman of the State Education commission, Col. Harry Berry, state commander of the American Legion, Lieut. Commander G. N. Weisheit, U. S. navy, and Gen. Baxter Secor, state adjutant-general, will be the principal speakers. The Great Lakes naval training station band, which was a part of the original one-thousand piece Sousa organization, will give a concert for the people of Memphis.

A. E. Huggins, navy publicity man from the bureau in New York, and who has been ahead of the governor and Gov. H. H. Lehman of the recruiting train on their speaking tour of the state, said that next week would complete the enlistments for the Tennessee and that the ship's complement would be filled if enlistments kept up as heavily as they have been for the past few weeks. Tennessee led the first two weeks in January.

Commander W. E. Chandle, recruiting officer for the Tennessee district, said that he expected to see the banner on the way for the entire drive, and that he was very anxious to close the campaign in Memphis.

The special train left Nashville on Jan. 13 and toured the eastern part of the state. It will leave Memphis, Tenn. and go to Covington, La., then Union City, La., Clarksville and then Nashville, Tenn. It will arrive in Memphis on Jan. 19.

C. E. Wagstaff, chief handmaster of the super-dreadnaught Tennessee, is in Memphis to secure musicians for the great battleship. Mr. Wagstaff will be in Memphis at the navy recruiting office, Goslar building, all day Friday for the purpose of examining applicants.

Capt. Leitch, commanding the great dreadnaught, selected Chief Wagstaff from among the best of his long and honorable service in the navy. Mr. Wagstaff was president Wilson's musician for the king and queen of Belgium, and before many of the crowned heads of the allied nations.

Now that enlistments for the Tennessee are practically closed and the complement is assured the officers of the ship are getting to work to secure the state's best musicians. These men will be sent direct to Nashville, where they will await the mobilization of the remainder of the band and will be escorted to New York by Mr. Wagstaff personally. Men between the ages of 18 and 25 are desirable. Most any instrument can be used, but clarinets and saxophones—the orchestra—are especially desirable.
