PEACE EFFORTS UPON TREATY NEAR BREAK

St. Louis Expert Directs Operation of Safety Zone System at Main and Madison During Busy Hours.

Memphis took its first lesson in the proper conduct of traffic Tuesday morning, with Lieut. Joseph A. Gerk, of the St. Louis police, in charge as instructor at Main street and Madison avenue.

Two safety zones were put into operation at 10 o'clock on Tuesday morning. A continuous line of traffic through the "groove" between the curbs and outside boundaries of the safety zone was kept moving.

Lieut. Gerk predicted Tuesday morning that the new safety zone plan conceived at downtown corners would be working out of the plan by which an automobile need not stop while a street car is taking on and discharging passengers at a downtown corner.

St. Louis, with 8,000 more automobiles in 1919 than in 1918, had three fewer accidents in the latter year, Lieut. Gerk said. Figures compiled by the St. Louis police department showed that there were only 87 auto accidents in which people were injured.

It will take a couple of months for Memphis to get accustomed to this new form of traffic design, but when they do, it will mean a change back for anything, I am certain.

St. Louis is the center of the public and parochial schools by means of pamphlets which citizens' committees working in cooperation with the city department distribute. This illustrates the principle of "Safety First" in the governing class.

Edwards, Democrat, in his inaugural address, promised to enter his campaign pledges that he "would do every lawful thing to have it determined that the present condition of affairs with respect to prohibition had been legally forced upon the people and that this state condition is satisfactory to them."

Presentation by the state attorney-general to the United States supreme court of a petition for decision as to the legality of the ratification of the eighteenth amendment and as to whether prohibition is a proper subject for legislation by the states, is the main contention "because of the grave doubt existing."

TEXAS CLAIMS AND OKLAHOMA BATTLE

AUSTIN, Texas, Jan. 20.—Serious threats by claimants of oil lands in dispute between Texas and Oklahoma that they will take the law in their own hands, present possibilities of a civil war along the Texas-Oklahoma boundary, said W. A. Keeling, assistant attorney-general today, and rangers have been urged to prevent this threatening disorder.

Mr. Keeling stated that he will leave for Wichita county tonight and that rangers have been ordered to report to Adjutant-General W. C. Cote, who has been in that section for several days. Mr. Keeling said that the disputed territory will be regarded as Texas land unless the federal courts decide that it belongs to Oklahoma.

Scandal Stirred Up by Admiral's Charges Recalls Action Taken by Taft for Foolish Speech Made Years Ago.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 20.—Admiral Sims, referred to jealously in naval circles as the "best British admiral in the American navy," because of his sympathetic attitude toward the British navy, for which American sailors have entertained always the keenest rivalry, has stirred up another international scandal.

Once before President Taft felt obliged to reprimand the admiral, when Sims for what became famous as his blood-thicker-than-water speech, while in the Red river valley, all the American army, were in the area.
