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DEMOCRATS MEET AT STATE CAPITAL

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Lloyd George With Andrew Bonar Law Plans New Party

LONDON, March 16.—A joint manifesto which will be signed by Premier Lloyd George and Andrew Bonar Law, will be issued in a few days stating the principles of a new party to be led by the premier, says the Daily Mail. It will be accompanied, the Mail declares, by an important reconstruction of the ministry, and for this reason announcement of appointments to the portfolios of labor, food and the board of trade, now vacant, has been postponed.

According to present intentions the name of the new party will be the "National Democratic." In addition to a meeting of liberals next Thursday, arrangements are being made for a conference of unionists, at which Mr. Bonar Law will announce his resignation from the leadership of that party, and will invite members to join the new organization. Unionists who have been adherents of Lloyd George are said to have decided to support him, but there are indications that the party will not be united in its adherence to the new combination. A revolt under the leadership of the Marquis of Salisbury and Lord Robert Cecil is expected, says the Daily Mail.

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PLAN HEALTH DRIVE IN LAFAYETTE COUNTY

OXFORD, Miss., March 16. (Sp.)—In carrying out the co-operative idea between the work of the state board of health and the Red Cross, plans are being taken shape for the putting on of a health campaign in Lafayette county. It is proposed to spend at least \$10,000 on health work in the county. The state board of health, under the direction of Dr. W. S. Leathers, stands ready to put up \$1,000, and the home service section of the Red Cross, which Miss Ella Somerville, of University, is secretary of the Lafayette county chapter, stands ready to put up \$2,500 if the citizens of the county through their board of supervisors will put up the other \$2,500, or one-fourth of the total amount.

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
