

PLAN OF COLCORD FIGHTED REAT FIGHT-LAURENCE

Men Prominent in Affairs of Nation Join in Move to Secure Ratification Except on Contested Sections.

WASHINGTON, March 29.—Samuel Colcord, a modest and gentlemanly man with kindly eyes and benign countenance, who represents the organization, has presented in President Wilson, through Secretary Taft, a petition for the ratification of the League of Nations, with the understanding that the League will be ratified except on the sections which are the subject of the appeal from the president to the people in an election.

Holds No Office.

Mr. Colcord has no office, no staff, no publicity organization, and no money. He is just an average citizen who feels so deeply about the delay in entering the League of Nations that he has decided to devote his own time and money to the cause.

Didn't See President.

Mr. Colcord did not see Mr. Wilson or his committee, but the memoranda he presented were, of course, laid before the president by the private secretary. Every day it is planned to add more names so that eventually thousands of persons whose names command public respect will be enlisted in the movement.

The president has not seen fit to reply to the senate resolution returning the treaty to him. Sometimes he welcomes occasion to speak indirectly and by implication the visit of Mr. Colcord and his committee may furnish that opportunity.

TO ENCOURAGE AVIATION.

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Notice to Delinquent Taxpayers

1919 State and County Taxes Became Delinquent on March 1, 1920

Under the law, penalties for the month of March amount to six and one-half per cent of the original amount of the taxes past due.

On April first the penalties will be increased to eight per cent and on May first to nine and one-half per cent, as provided by law.

During the month of May all property upon which 1919 state and county taxes have not been paid will be advertised for sale, and on June first all such property upon which taxes have not been paid will be sold to the state, in accordance with the law. This will entail an additional expense of one dollar on each tax bill, to cover cost of such advertising.

Taxpayers are hereby notified of these increasing penalties, the application of which is made mandatory by the tax laws of the State of Tennessee.
