Packard Believes In Might; Ford And Two Men Injured

Evidently believing in the former kaiser's famous adage about might being right, a large Packard automobile Friday ran roughshod over a Ford car at Poplar avenue and Decatur street, tossing it, badly damaged, onto the sidewalk and painfully injuring W. B. Fontaine, 1409 Harbert avenue, and C. H. Diffe, 212 High street, the occupants.

The accident occurred, according to police, when the Packard, traveling east at a high rate of speed, attempted to pass between the Ford and a street car going in the same direction. Without hesitation or fear of its smaller antagonist the Packard entered the fray, which was quickly ended when the Ford was jammed against the telephone post, a mass of wreckage.

The larger car, apparently uninjured, continued its way out Poplar avenue, unidentified by pedestrians and police. It was driven by a negro.

Fontaine and Diffe were carried to the General hospital, where their injuries, consisting of cuts and bruises, were dressed. Fontaine is superintendent of the California Vacuum Co., and Diffe is a chauffeur for the same firm.

The Ford suffered damages in the form of smashed front wheels, a broken radiator and fender, and shattered windshield.


