

### Two Pullmans Will Take Rotarians To National Meeting

### PLASTERER SUES FOR LIEN UPON PROPERTY

An attachment on a subcontractor's lien in chancery court by J. V. Pieroni was requested Saturday to a bill of, plastering contractor, against J. B. Holt, Hattie L. Kiesling, Alfred J. Kiesling, the State Investment company, trustee, and the Columbia Mortgage and Trust company.

Pieroni alleges that he got a subcontract to plaster a house which Holt had contracted to build for the Kieslings. He alleges that the amount of his contract was \$500, and that Holt paid him only \$125. He, therefore, sued out a lien on the property, naming all concerned as defendants. ### RAID GROCERY STORE AND CAPTURE WINE

Attracted by the sight of "everybody" down there getting drunk, an Inspector of Detectives W. T. Griffin expressed it, a squad of four detective sergeants Saturday at noon swooped down on the grocery and butcher shop belonging to Vic Bosino, 26, 230 East Calhoun avenue, to find the cause. When they had completed their probe, they had 10 quart of wine, some two barrels of main wine, wash and Hostine himself in tow.

The raiding squad consisted of Sergeant Carpenter, Jamison, York and Carter, dispatched to the scene by Griffin, who declared he had heard that everybody around there was imbibing too freely of late.

The wine and wash was found in the rear of the grocery and butcher shop, no attempt being made, police admit, to conceal it from inspection. According to police, the two barrels contained about 75 gallons of wash. Two quarts of the wine was found behind the counter, the officers allege, and another half quart in the grocery box.

Bosino was charged with violating the liquor law, although police admit they had no evidence of a sale against him. Bosino maintained he made the wine for his own personal use. The wine and wash was confiscated and looked up at police headquarters.


