

Daredevils of Air To Risk Lives For Title

The largest number of daredevils ever assembled for single event are now in Memphis to contest for records, titles and purses above the flying field at North Memphis Driving park Sunday. They are to meet in the greatest carnival ever staged in the air. Feats never accomplished are to be attempted. Men and women, whose aspiration is to thrill will set the pulses of the crowd thrumming by hazardous feats.

When Roselle Roberts, the woman who seeks the world's title as queen of the air, trips around on the spinning wings of her plane, hangs suspended from the landing gear and performs her feats of balancing the crowd need not wonder at her wonderful nerve, for she is the niece of that fearless hero of our early history, Col. William B. Chatham, better known as "Buffalo Bill." Not only does Miss Roberts claim to be the world's most daring wing walker and aerial performer, but Sunday she expects to be acclaimed the champion woman parachute jumper. The 25 judges who will decide winners of the various contests.

Big interest centers in the hazardous attempt to be made by three birmen, Haldean, Wright and Johnson, to change from a spinning automobile to a plane flying overhead. Three men have died attempting this feat and others have been injured. They were forced to abandon the exhibition field. The three men entered in the contest Sunday are confident of ability to perform a feat that was pronounced by the late Lieut. Locklear as impossible after he himself was badly injured attempting it.

In the fight for stunt flying honors there are five entrants, including Miss Marie LeCroy, Paris aviatrice, who recently started the aviation world by looping the loop in her biplane. In this contest five planes will be in the air at one time.

Of most importance to the aviation and amusement world will be the contest between George W. Wright and "Bolder" Burns for Locklear's crown and title and the purse of gold that goes to the winner.

Wright claims the distinction of being the only man now living, all others having lost their lives in the attempt, who has changed from the top to bottom plane without the use of rope or ladder. Sunday, for the first time, he will attempt a feat that he claims to be the aviation world. He will stand upright on the top wing of his plane while the pilot loops the loop.

Burns declares he will duplicate every feat of Wright's and will conclude his performance with a new thriller.

Among the noted flyers, wingwalkers, parachute jumpers and stunt performers in Sunday's tournament are: Miss Roselle Roberts, Miss Marie LeCroy, Miss Louise Lutes, George W. Wright, Spidier Jumper, George W. Haldean, John T. Prier, Eugene Johnson, Sam Harrell, Leonard McMullin, R. E. Carter, Fredrick Carter, S. W. Morrison and S. L. McEade.

Two of the big illustrated weeklies will have their photographers on the ground to record each event on film. The contests will begin promptly at 2:30 p.m.

BEN EDDINS, JONESBORO, TO CONTEST ELECTION

JONESBORO, Ark., Aug. 24 (Sp.)—Ben Eddins, who was on the face of the returns, defeated by William Fuller as the Democratic nominee for county and probate judge, has filed a suit in the circuit court alleging that he is the duly elected nominee. The case will come up at the next term of the civil division, which meets Monday week, September 8.

Mr. Eddins claims that 175 illegal votes were counted for Fuller in eight different precincts. The votes are alleged to be illegal on account of persons casting them not having resided in the state and county the required length of time to vote, not having poll tax receipts and not being of age.

MEXICO IS STUDYING FOREIGNERS' LOSSES

Policy to Protect Citizens of Other Nations Announced.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 23.—The Mexican government has taken up for study the problems growing out of injuries suffered by foreigners during the last two years of unrest in the republic, the embassy announced yesterday, as well as "of losses caused by the disposal of funds not belonging to the national treasury, and for the nonpayment of credits, due and interests in arrears thereon."

"The standard policy of the Mexican government shall always be the endeavor to afford all guarantees to foreigners entering into Mexican soil," the statement said.

Official reports from Mexico City say conditions continue to improve daily, the embassy said, and railroad, telegraph and telephone communications are in perfect normal condition.

An official statement reiterated the decision of President de la Huerta to surrender his office to the candidate elected at the polls Sept. 5.

NEGROES FOR ROBERTS.

NASHVILLE, Tenn., Aug. 23.—A delegation of negro women, members of the Mosaic Temple of America, in session here, escorted by several negro men Friday marched into the hall of representatives at the capitol where they were addressed by a negro ex-service man on their new duties, the speaker telling them to return to their homes and vote for Gov. Roberts, who, he said, had done more for the negroes than any other governor of the state.




