McClellan said he was convinced certain players had deliberately "thrown" three games in Boston on the Eastern tour.

Several of the players noticed how the scoreboard affected the others, he added, "and we felt all along that these men were regarding their playing according to the play of other teams."

No announcement has been given as to whether any of the White Sox players will be called before the grand jury when it reconvenes in special session on Tuesday to continue the baseball inquiry.
