FAST STEPPERS.

Trotters on the Way from Frisco to New York.

Train No. 6, on the Union Pacific road, brought in a car last evening, which was divided into five box stalls and contained as many speeders from the Pacific coast, belonging to Edward S. Stokes, of New York, to which latter city they are going. The horses were taken off here for a three days rest, and are now stabled in Jim Stephenson's brick barn. Mr. George Crooks has them in charge.

The first one seen by a reporter of The Bee this afternoon was Empress, a beautiful chestnut mare, six years old, and as handsome as a picture. It would be impossible to imagine a horse with finer points than this mare. Although the journey from San Francisco has been a long one she came out of it clean and glossy, and her legs are as symmetrical as a deer's. This mare was the property of A. C. Deitz, of Oakland, who raised her. She is bred from Whipple's Hambletonian and the famous twenty-mile mare Kitty Trax. When four years old, Empress astonished her owner and everybody else by shutting out Santa Claus in a hot race at Oakland and making the remarkable record of 2:24. Her record could now be lowered down in the teens, if it were so desired.

Gladstone, a powerful sorrel gelding, occupies the next state. He is one of those horses that have come from the Pacific slope with no other pedigree than that Topsy laid claim to. He "grewed" and was lugged about until two years ago when someone discovered there was speed in his big feet, and put him in trim. He can trot in the twenties, and has a record of 2:31. Being but nine years old, he is expected to make up for his lack of early education by making things warm for the blooded horses in the next circuit, and if the report of his having made a half mile in 1:09 be correct, he will doubtless do so.

A handsome little brown mare named Bellflower is next, and she clearly shows her good breeding. She is eight years old, has achieved a number of well-earned victories on the coast, and possesses a record of 2:27.

Two fine colts occupy the remaining stalls. One is a black filly, and the other a bay gelding. They are respectively three and five years old, and possess good trotting blood. The five horses are each valued very highly, and their combined cost was about \$20,000. They leave for New York on Tuesday, making a short stop in Chicago.
