The first ballot for auditor resulted: Henry, 24; Johnson, 1; Peck, 2; Oberholzer, 70; Kite, 38.

The second ballot gave Beardley 25%, Lewis 10%, Johnson 1%, Peck 2%, Oberholzer 70%, and Kite 38%.

On the third ballot there was a general change in votes and Captain Lyons' nomination was secured.

The other state officers were filled by renomination by acclamation as follows: A. J. Baker, attorney general; G. B. Gray, clerk of the supreme court; J. Ebersole, supreme court reporter.
