New Sidewalks in 1888. A Gross Error as to Their Cost Officially Corrected. "Say!"

What was the matter with Mr. Allen? "Don't know." But his thoughtful statement is the basis for a heavy editorial upon the enormous burdens put upon the people.

It is unnecessary alarming. The public improvements—paving, sewerage, etc., will probably cost \$1,000,000. But \$1,000,000 in sidewalks in 1888 is well, it's absurd on the face of it.

What are the facts? "There is a district in the business part of town, you know, in which only stone or cement walks are allowed. At 25 cents per square foot, which is a fair price, no more walks in the stone district would not exceed \$180,000 in cost."

But we know this: "About one-third of the walks in that district were laid with stone pavements in 1888. It is hardly possible for the contractors to lay all the other walks in the district this year, even if they were disposed to do so."
