Among his victims are Max Meyer, Frederick, Falconer, and Norris & Wilcox, although none of these lost large amounts. The officers finally located him in the house of one Wilcox at the corner of Twenty-eighth and Claming streets, and last night paid him a professional visit. While one of them guarded the front door the other looked after the back entrance, but Nelson, becoming alarmed, made a break for the side door, and went over an eight-foot embankment. A lively chase ensued, but he was finally captured and admitted his guilt at the same time offering to settle anything that was against him. He admitted that the boots he stole came from Norris & Wilcox's, and said he had been in Nebraska City. As the police have been on the look-out for him for some time the arrest is an important one.

At a later hour, the records of a similar crime were looked up, and traces of the prisoner's handiwork discovered. He was charged with committing them and finally broke down and confessed. His work extends over the entire country. Some of his more recent exploits were in Lawrence, Atchison, Topeka and Leavenworth, the former town having detected 140 of them.
