## NOT EARNING THEIR MONEY.

That is what Mr. Babcock says of the Public School Principals.

### A SWEEPING REFORM PROPOSED.

He would begin it by making a reduction of \$300 per year in each of their salaries.

Mr. Babcock had called a meeting of the board of education for last night, that the question of teachers' salaries might be discussed. Most of the members responded to the call and congregated around the secretary's table, where they talked and smoked for several hours.

Mr. Babcock did most of the talking. He thought the teachers had altogether too many vacations and too much play. He prefaced his speech by saying: "The pupils go into the schools in dresses. Nobody knows who goes in and nobody knows who goes up." He said that no principal could earn more than \$100 per month, and he did not believe that any of them should be paid more than that amount.

"That is so," said Mr. Wehrer, as he perched himself upon a stool. "The great trouble is we pay all our teachers too much money, and for one man in favor of cutting down all the salaries."

"You ought to cut down the salaries of the janitors," remarked Mr. Smith.

"I guess not," responded Wehrer, "those people are the ones who do the work, and they should be the ones to receive the pay."

"Well," said Mr. Babcock, "I know we can get competent principals for less money than we pay now."

"I think the influential citizen has too much to say about the hiring of teachers," said Mr. Morrison. "The influential citizen has some aunt, cousin or some other relation and he generally gets her a position in the school."

Mr. Babcock then sprung his scheme. It was to cut the wages of all the principals who have been receiving \$1,500 per year to \$900, and those who have been receiving \$1,100 to \$500 per year.

"I am not only in favor of this," said Wehrer, "but I would like to see all of the teachers' salaries cut 30 percent."

"What I say is proposed in an open meeting," said Mr. Points. "I don't propose to discuss this matter and have it go out to the public. What I say I propose to say right before this committee."

"There is no use of talking, Mr. Babcock," said Mr. Smith; "your theory is not good. You can't ask principals to handle twelve room schools at the same salary as those who have charge of the eight room buildings."

"It holds good in St. Louis," said Mr. Babcock.

"Well, this isn't St. Louis," said Mr. Smith.

"The idea is," continued Mr. Babcock, "you can't get just as much work out of a teacher and pay her \$800 as you do if you pay her \$1,200 a year."

"You can't get good teachers at \$800 per year," said Mr. Morrison.

"You don't know as you have them now, and if they are poor ones they stand in and are not removed," continued Mr. Babcock.

"That is a reflection upon the honesty and ability of the members of this board, and I resent it," remarked Mr. Morrison.

The question of janitors' salaries was then taken up and discussed. There were several cuts proposed, all of which were opposed by Mr. Wehrer.

After considerable talk on the side the committee adjourned, undecided as to what report to make to the board at its session tomorrow night.

**The J.C. Wilcox Perjury Cases.**  
The J.C. Wilcox perjury cases were on trial in the police court yesterday afternoon. All of the evidence was introduced and the arguments will be submitted next Saturday afternoon at 3 o'clock.

afternoon at 3 o'clock. The prosecution alleged that the defendant committed perjury when he swore in his motion for a continuance, that he was unable at that time to secure material evidence, and that his case would be prejudiced by going to trial at that time. The defendant swore that the affidavit sworn to by the attorney for the prosecution, because he (Wilcox) did not know in what shape his books were, as he had not had an opportunity to examine them, and he did not know the contents of his attorney's affidavits or whether he owed them anything or not. He was completely overwhelmed when he filed 125 claims against him and he regarded the continuance as absolutely necessary in order to allow him to prepare for trial.

The case occupied the greater part of the afternoon.

### SEAS OF FILTH.

**They Are to be Obliterated at the Expense of Lot Owners.**

The members of the board of public works have completed the list showing the death dealing pools of stagnant water about the city. Besides this, they have condemned the places, and later in the season, or as soon as they can secure bids for doing the work, will order all of these holes filled at the expense of the lot owners.

Of the holes included in the advertisement there are nearly one hundred, many of which are covered to a depth of many feet with stagnant water, into which has been thrown stable refuse, garbage, dead animals and all kinds of filth.

At the southeast corner of Seventh and Pierce streets there is a pool covering some four or five lots. The water is of a dark green color, and vision stirred up emits a foul and sickening odor. Almost upon the banks of this foul marsh families live, or rather exist, half a dozen of them have children sick and the doctors in attendance attribute the cause to the gases arising from the pool.

At the southeast corner of Sixteenth and Vinson streets there is a deep lake, over one-quarter of an acre of ground. This inland sea is used as a bath tub by the boys of the neighborhood, and as a dump for garbage and other refuse.

In the vicinity of Eighteenth and Dorcas streets there is a chain of these lakes, some about the size of a pond, some as large as a lake, and while some are clear and deep, others are foul and have a smell that is only equalled by a tan yard. Families live all around the pools, and use them as watering places for their cows. In this vicinity there have been a number of cases of diphtheria and typhoid fever, the cause of which is attributed to the great body of stagnant water nearby.

On the south side of Farnam, near Thirty-eighth street, there is a hole covering half an acre of ground. This is filled with water, out of which grow rank weeds, their growth being encouraged by the offal and garbage deposited. At this place a dairyman waters his cows, providing the milk about the city. The neighbors have protested, but the milkman insists that there is nothing wrong with the water, although it is covered with a green scum and is of the color of pea soup.

Near Twentieth and Pierce streets there is one of the worst disease breeding holes in the city. It is a long deep pool, filled with dead dogs and cats which float upon the surface. In this vicinity a large amount of sickness has prevailed during the entire season.

On South Thirtieth street, below Vinson, where the street has been graded, there are a dozen or more pools, around which settlers live in large numbers. Sickness has prevailed among the residents and many children have died of diphtheria.

Numerous other stench holes are scattered about the city, the principal ones being located at Twenty-eighth and Dodge, Fourteenth and Vinson, Twenty-fourth and Mason, Thirty-fifth and Dodge, Twenty-seventh and Pacific, Twentieth and Dorcas, Thirty-first and Howard and Thirty-fourth and Pratt streets.

### COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

#### Grading Estimates Allowed and Appropriations Approved.

Mr. Berlin was the only member absent when the county commissioners met yesterday afternoon.

It being rainy and a good day to loaf, the lobby was filled with farmers of Douglas county.

As usual, the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved.

Under instructions from County Attorney Mahoney, the board gave the Manville covering company authority to cover the slum pipe in the county hospital. S. L. Pope & Co. had the contract, but had failed to do the work. The cost of doing the work will be charged up against the Pope company. There are 14,600 feet of pipe to cover, and the bill will amount to about \$3,000.

Van Gilder & Co. had a contract to furnish the poor farm with meat. During the months of June and July they overcharged the county \$4. County Attorney Mahoney proposed a remedy consisting in not to contract with Van Gilder & Co., but to cancel the matter was referred.

The county treasurer reported that the county products owed \$12,275 of personal tax for the year of 1888 and 1889. He asked for a horse and buggy that he might reach the delinquents. His request was granted, and he will be allowed \$25 per month, not to exceed six months, and that the bill be paid out of the tax collected.

A. C. McCracken of South Omaha resigned his office as constable, and James H. Fleming was appointed.

Grading estimates were allowed as follows: Bams & Knight, \$73,424; B. P. Knight, \$2,848; Barnes & Knight, \$10,041; O. Davis, \$1,303.25.

The bond of the Omaha & Florence land company was approved. The idea is for the company to grade State street in the city of Florence. The bond provided that should the grading exceed the sum of \$3,000, the business would pay the excess. The county attorney said that some of the work had already been performed, and that the only question that remained was whether or not the county had the right to make a levy to pay for the grading that had already been done.

Mr. O'Keefe said that the county had already paid \$3,100 for grading the street, and that he was not obligated to do any more work upon it.

The resolution to advertise for 300 tons of hard coal and the soft and steam coal to be used at the hospital was adopted. The resolution provides that the coal shall be weighed on the city scales.

Appropriation sheet No. 3 of the road fund, amounting to \$1,107.87; sheet No. 29 of the bridge fund, amounting to \$36,45; sheet No. 77 of the general fund, amounting to \$50,949; sheet No. 4 of the road fund, amounting to \$1,452.86; sheet No. 23 of the bridge fund, amounting to \$25,661; and sheet No. 7 of the general fund, amounting to \$38,552, were read and passed.

The bond of J. M. Robinson, who lets grade a road in the vicinity of Seymour park, was read and approved. The contract calls for the removal of 15,000 cubic yards of earth and gravel Robinson until December 15 to complete the work.

### HOW MARSHALL DIED.

#### He Failed to Realize that He Was in a Dangerous Place.

Corner Harrigan, held an inquest at Swanson & Valien's, corner of Seventeenth and Cumming streets, at 10 a. m. yesterday, over the remains of Frank Marshall, the Missouri Pacific brakeman who was killed by the collision on Friday night.

The testimony of the crew showed that they were taking seven loaded cars to South Omaha, and when West Side was reached stopped to pick up ten more. At that point the grade was quite steep, and the seven cars which were behind the engine pushed it ahead with great force.

Marshall was standing on the footboard on the front end of the engine when it started down the grade.

Engineer Harding said that the brakes would not hold and yelled to Marshall, who nearly a hundred feet from the other cars, to get off, at the same time reversing his engine and applying the brakes.

Marshall either did not hear or did not heed the engine's warning, and he fell from the engine, crashed into the ten loaded cars ahead of it with sufficient force to break the sills of the car and force the front end of the engine well into the car.

Marshall, it was held, had plenty of time to get off the footboard before the engine struck the cars in front as the train was moving rapidly down the grade. The jury returned a verdict that the deceased had come to his death from injuries sustained in a collision between a switch engine and freight car, the collision being unavoidable.

The remains were taken last evening to Salem, Ill., the old home of the dead man, by his brother, D. W. Marshall.
