SUCCESSFUL OPENING OF THE MEETING

LYONS, Neb., Aug. 2.—[Special Telegram to The Bee.]—The summer meeting of the Everett Racing Association of this place opened up today under the most favorable conditions. The track, which is a finished kite, was only completed last June, but today it is the equal of any in the world, and is so pronounced by all horsemen who have visited it. It consists of 170 fine box stalls, every one of which is occupied by an animal of greater or lesser note. It is constructed so that the benches running entirely around the course, both within and without the track, can be reached with ease from the grandstand within twelve hours, which is of incalculable benefit in keeping it in perfect condition. The soil is a tough and heavy loam, and the surface of the highest ratio of speed and never becomes "sloppy."
