DOWN TO DETAILS

German Army Bill as Good as Passed by the Present Reichstag.

ONLY QUESTION NOW CONCERNS CASH From Whence Will the Money Come to Bear the Added Expense?

MIGUEL HAS HIS PLANS IN READINESS

Approved by the Kaiser and Endorsed by the Chancellor as Excellent.

WILL TAKE MORE INTEREST IN COLONIES

Emperor Expresses a Wish that the Influence of Germany be Made More Manifest in This Direction—Representing Annexed Provinces.

Special to THE BEE.—Truth to tell, all it does not matter what the politician or newspaper charges, or says about it, the much discussed military bill is fait accompli, and those who choose to prolong the discussion are merely wretches, who are churning up the after details, such as where is the money to come from, etc., in hopes of obtaining concessions for their party. They want to wring all the concessions they can get. The bill will probably be voted on the 18th. The anti-Semites have proved beyond measure, Boeckel considers, that they hold the balance of power, and he dreams of an alliance with the chancellor to crush the Jews. News has just reached me from a sure source that an understanding has been reached between Dr. Miguel and Count von Caprivi in regard to the budget to cover the military bill's added expense. The plan was submitted to the kaiser, who highly approved it and gave his consent to its introduction. Of course, the kaiser's consent is not sufficient, but Miguel will probably receive the high honor of the nomination to be financial minister of the empire. Miguel takes a holiday of six weeks, beginning August 1, after which he will set to work on the completion of his latest financial scheme. Caprivi looks forward to the autumn carefully, confident in the support of this financial general, who has so often appeared to him as a rival.

From the autumn maneuvers being abandoned, as reported two weeks ago, it is now known that the center will be of capital importance. They will be conducted absolutely on the scale of a small war, as realistic as possible.

Abusing Each Other Publicly. Between the center party and the "reptile" press a great storm of personalities has broken out. The amusing side of it is that the latter discovered that Lieber, now the center leader, formerly lived from the sale of a certain quantity of wine, which never did him one good but himself, of which the sale was finally forbidden as a fraud. In fact the coarsest insults are finding their way into print on both sides, giving us little good, but amusing reading. In the meantime Germania solemnly, in the name of the Almighty, confures the center party, to vote against the bill, to be so earnest in this attitude it seems that the center of the center might be moved to cut off that party from voting for the bill.

Report has it that Count Herbert Bismarck has been trying to form a party round himself which could oppose the bill unless the government first declared its financial policy as regards the measure. The report is denied, but it is likely that Bismarck, who, they say, much more likely will join the family at Bismarck and not vote at all.

Working Up on Colonial Affairs. The kaiser, I understand, wishes much more energy thrown into Germany's colonial policy, which since the days of Bismarck, has flagged considerably. The chancellor has received his orders and it is probable the colonial office will have lively times during the autumn.

It is said that with the coming of the head of the colonial office is much out of favor at the present moment. The failure of the German colonial policy seems to date since the time of the mission of Wissmann. There has been the defeat in East Africa, and the complications over the Cameroons, whilst the French have got a footing in the latter country. Dr. Zinggraff has already accused the government of building him in a hole, and now Baron Guido Voelcker, at Munich, raises his voice against Governor Zimmerer, who, he asserts, betrayed his brother, who was massacred at Balinga. With it he brings what seems to be undeniable proof, and further brings grave charges of disorganization against the colonial office, and whilst reserving to himself the right to raise the question in the Reichstag, has addressed himself to the kaiser and the regent of Bavaria. This is why trouble arises at the colonial office, and why the inevitable sum of 50,000,000 marks will be asked for in the Reichstag to further the colonial policy. The kaiser, I hear, is much satisfied with the visit of the czar. The meeting was cordial in the extreme, with a great deal of embracing. The police were on hand in large force to see that nothing unfortunate happened and were most careful of the inspection of the lines over which the trains passed. I hear the subject of their conversation was the recent disturbance in Persia.

Holdings Down Annexed Provinces. Bebel has tried to raise up an outcry against the action of the authorities in Alsace during the election, but on this point the government refuses to budge, and once more seems as though moderate were to be again enforced in the annexed provinces. To this end there has been rumors Prince Hohenzollern would be relieved of the governorship, but this is not worthy of credence, seeing his grand services. Moreover, he has not enough money to maintain a position worthy his lineage, whilst the return of his son to the Reichstag as a supporter of the crown is a great victory and has given special pleasure at court as showing the provinces are at last becoming Germanized. This policy seems to reign in the northern annexed provinces of Schleswig-Holstein, where the conflicts between the people and authorities, which latter have behaved very harshly, have been frequent. Amongst other prohibiting private persons from keeping carriages, a danger in case of war.

General Rumson, the United States minister, has been all week very busy at the legation, having been called back on special work. He left his family at Elms, where the minister, who will not become an ambassador till autumn, will join them in ten days if possible.

His Pet Measure Was Passed by the Reichstag on Yesterday.

GERMANY'S ARMY BILL IS NOW A LAW

After a Hard Struggle It Has Been Adopted by a Small Majority.

OPPOSITIONS OF THE BILL DISSATISFIED

They Find Small Consolation in the Small Majority Given the Measure.

VON CAPRIVI IS TO BE MADE A PRINCE

His Work for the Bill Appreciated by the Kaiser—Eastern Affairs Becoming Pressing—The Fodder Question an Important One.

BERLIN, July 15.—The government hoped that the third reading of the army bill today would be merely formal and that the session of the Reichstag would close in time to enable the emperor and the ministers to congratulate each other on the passage of the bill by a luncheon, but it was otherwise. Chancellor von Caprivi has been suffering so severely from the influenza virus in his legs that his doctors urged him not to appear in the house. Though he was very ill last night, he was obliged to continue his official duties. The excitement of the situation revived him today, however, and he looked happy. He was accompanied to the Reichstag by Dr. von Botlicher, secretary of the home office, and Freiherr Gieberstein, minister of foreign affairs.
