

shatter the door. The first effort failed, but a second was more successful, and the robbers rushed in on M. M. Weist and Byron Hamble, the express messenger and assistant, who, on looking into the muzzles of a rifle and a half dozen revolvers, obeyed the order to "throw up your hands." One of the robbers with a heavy sledge knocked the knob off the express safe, while another produced a drill, and in a few moments had a hole through the strong box into which a dynamite cartridge was inserted. This was exploded without apparent result, and was followed by another and another, but when a fifth was fired the door gave way and the robbers seized the contents, and, running toward a little grove where their horses were concealed, fired a volley into the air to intimidate possible pursuers, swung into their saddles and rode away into the night with their booty.

The conductor and his crew left very quiet and the passengers were not alarmed until the affair was about over, when there was a great scramble to secure watches, pocketbooks and other valuables. In a short time the train moved on.

Express Messenger Weist went on to Chicago to report.

Special Agent Alonzo Wygant came to the scene of the robbery and took charge of the secret service of the company, which was centralized here.

MAY BE DAYS YET.

Express Company's Officials Do Not Know the Extent of Their Loss.

BERFAZO, Sept. 12.—Colonel John Hyms of this city, who is superintendent of the detectives of the United States Express company, left tonight for the scene of the robbery. Officials of the company here declare it may be days yet before the extent of the loss is known, and it may be \$50,000 or \$50,000. If the robbers carried off the bags it is probable they took the express men inside here. The messenger of the booted car was M. M. Weist of 105 Glenwood avenue. A telegram came this afternoon requesting the express officials to notify his wife that he is all right.

The robbed express car reached here early this evening. The exterior it does not seem to have been roughly handled, but its interior is different. It is pretty well torn to pieces. The safe which was blown open stands a little to one side of the door through which the robbers forced an entrance. Its door is off, its interior is barren. The door was blown into seven pieces. The car shows no marks of bullets either inside or outside.

Six blocks of silver bullion, which were in the car, were not touched. Neither were the small portable safes in which small sums of money were carried.

Says It Was Very Small.

CHICAGO, Sept. 12.—The officials of the United States Express company were all extremely nervous regarding the amount secured by the robbers at Mendota, Ill. General Manager C. H. Crosby of the company has made the following statement tonight:

"I have been looking over the books and receiving dispatches all day and I can say now the loss is going to turn out very small indeed. I have not received full particulars and will not until I hear from Messenger Weist, who continued on to Buffalo, which is the terminus of his run. I have approximated the loss within a few dollars, however."

KILLED BY MORPHINE.

An Oration on the Fatal Drug Causes Mrs. Ed Bennett's Death.

Mrs. Ed Bennett of 3021 Pacific street died at 6:30 o'clock last night from the effects of morphine poisoning. It was at first rumored that the drug had been taken with suicidal intent, but this theory was exploded by the testimony of the daughter of the deceased, who stated that her mother had for the past fourteen or fifteen years been in the habit of taking morphine for "heart trouble," as she, the mother, always claimed. According to the statement of the dead woman's husband, who is a night watchman for the Omaha Browning association, he arrived home an hour or two later than usual yesterday morning, having had some errands to attend to, and found his wife sitting on the porch, apparently asleep. He saw through the window that she had prepared breakfast as usual, and attempted to awaken her and have her join him in the morning meal, but he was unable to arouse her. Finally, he was unsuccessful, he carried her into the house and laid her on the bed, after which he summoned the neighbors. Doctors Impey and Sprague were at once sent for and worked over the woman until she died, at 6:30 o'clock, without restoring her to consciousness.

Mrs. Bennett was about 35 years of age, and had two children by a former husband, whose name, it is understood, is Moore, and who is a resident of Omaha. She was divorced from him some time ago, and married Bennett a year ago last winter. Both of her two children are grown, the daughter being a married woman. It is said that the deceased and her second husband got along amicably, and that there was no domestic trouble to prompt her to suicide.

As the circumstances almost conclusively to accidental poisoning, it is unlikely that an inquest will be held.

NATIONAL CORDAGE COMPANY.

Steps to Reorganize the Concern as the Waterbury Company, Limited.

New York, Sept. 12.—The initial step in the reorganization of the National Cordage company was made today. It was the filing of a certificate of incorporation of the "Waterbury company, limited," at the county clerk's office in Jersey City. The incorporators of the new company are James M. Waterbury and Chauncey Marshall of the old company, and Charles W. King, the vice president of the Corporation Trust company of Jersey City. According to the articles filed, the capital stock is \$2,400,000, of which \$1,000,000 is preferred, and on which 6 per cent cumulative dividends are to be paid. There will be \$800,000 of common stock. The company will do a general cordage business and is authorized to acquire the good will and franchises and to assume the assets and liabilities of any firm or corporation in the cordage business and enter into agreements which shall appear expedient for the protection of the company.

There was a report this afternoon that the affairs of the Cordage trust were in the hands of the courts and that witnesses had been before them today. "The cases," said Mr. Nicol, the district attorney, "will not be limited to the grand jury until I can get over the papers. If I cannot find sufficient prima facie evidence the matter will be dropped."

Order of Chosen Friends.

St. Louis, Sept. 12.—The supreme council of the Order of Chosen Friends for the United States and Canada opened its ninth biennial session in the Druids hall today. Mayor Walbridge made a brief speech of welcome. Supreme Chancellor H. H. Morse of New York responded for the 38,000 members of the order.

Chancellor Morse's biennial report and the report of B. Linn of Indianapolis, supreme secretary, were received. Then W. J. Walton of Washington, supreme treasurer, reported, showing the finances to be in a flourishing condition.
