

OMAHA LIVE STOCK MARKET

Rush of Common Range Cattle to Market Continues in Full Force.

PRICES OF GOOD STOCK REMAIN STEADY

Cows Active and Higher-Feeders in Demand-Hogs Scarce and Higher Under Brisk Inquiry-Sellers Hold.

Monday, Oct. 30.

There was the usual first day's liberal receipts of cattle and sheep and the usual light run of hogs. While the supply of cattle over 6,000 head was large, it fell nearly 2,000 short of last Monday's record of 7,786, which was the heaviest in the history of the yards. One prominent buyer said he never saw such a small proportion of desirable cattle with such large receipts. There were very few good beef steers and quite a few good feeders and cows, but there was a world of half fat stock here fit neither for beef nor feeders. For beef the market was active and fully steady. Common to prime 1,250 to 1,517-lb. cornfed calves sold readily at \$4.15 and \$3.25, while common to good western steers went at from \$2.85 to \$3.85. On the half fat the market was dull and weak for the start.

The cow market was active and prices ruled strong to be and the higher than Saturday. Out of over 200 cars received less than 40 cars were cows. Local houses all wanted a few and there was some outside demand. Choice fat heifers sold up to \$3.25, but the bulk of the market was in the 1,000 to 1,200 lb. range. Stock changed hands at \$2 to \$2.25. Calves were in good demand and firm at \$2.25 to \$2.40. There was no change in the market for rough stock and trading was mostly around \$1.50 to \$2.25.

There was a fairly active trade in stockers and feeders and prices ruled steady to a shade stronger than the close of last week. Both regular dealers and outsiders were in the field buying, and as the supply was not excessive the movement was brisk throughout. Good to choice feeders are quoted at from \$1 to \$3.50, fair to good at from \$2.50 to \$3.50 with common to inferior at from \$2 to \$2.25.
