TEMPTATION TO LAND GRABBERS

Under the provisions of the act the allotment of lands to the Winnebago and Omaha Indians at the agency in Thurston county was begun, the first allotment being made in 1889. The allotting company, the Flournoy company, manifested itself shortly thereafter, and the Flournoy company was organized and began the illegal leasing of the allotted lands during the latter part of 1890 and the early part of 1891...
