CONDITION OF THE FARMER

A Reply to Secretary Morton's Article on "Farmers' Fallacies and Furrows."

WHY THE PRICE OF WHEAT DECLINED

Increased Production and Multiplied Average Cuts in Prices—Prices of Farm Products Decline with the Cost of What Farmers Consume.

In the June issue of the Forum Hon. J. Sterling Morton, secretary of agriculture, gives us some light upon matters pertaining to "Farmers, Fallacies and Furrows." According to this authority there was a time in this country when the popular aspiration was to be a farmer. It was, however, more than fifty years ago that such a condition existed, and since that time popular sentiment has reversed itself.

Mr. Morton says that "in those primitive days there was even more anxiety on the part of the people to get into the country and become farmers than there is now on the part of farmers to become city people." But while Mr. Morton almost defies the colonial farmer and his more immediate successors; calls attention to the fact that eleven earlier presidents of the United States were called from their farms to take charge of the country; and says that the (farmer) was looked upon as "the one man whose virtues, intelligence and station were held in reverence and veneration—while thus enlarging the farmer of the good old days that are gone—he (Mr. Morton) talks as though farming were overdone, and as though the very act of emulating the much-praised farmer of olden times has resulted in overproduction of farm crops and the permanent reduction of prices of farm products.

This view helps some small grains, which are greatly benefited if not made sure, though it is still looking fine before the rain, which has brightened up everything wonderfully. The first-class crop is assured and corn and sugar beets will be immensely benefited, thus keeping up the unbroken record of no crop failure in this part of the state.

Slide for Life, Courtland Beach tonight. SHOCKLEY NOT ROBBED. Complaint Charging Embezzlement Filed—Has Left the City.

A complaint was filed yesterday by William Feiler, of Feiler Bros., grocers, twenty-fourth and Clark streets, against Charles A. Shockley, a clerk formerly in their employ, for embezzlement.

The information charges that Shockley took \$50 and other small amounts, the sum of which is not yet known, but it is thought it may reach something like \$100.
