C. A. Day Shoots G. W. Thorn and Then Fires at the Friends of His Victim.

ST. LOUIS, April 2.—The saloon of Louis Cella, candidate for the house of delegates, at Twenty-first and Washington avenue, was the scene of a murder about noon today.

Thorn was taken to the city hospital, where it was said he could not live more than a few hours. Day was arrested and locked up at the Chestnut street station.

Thorn was in Cella's saloon, known as "The Place," with some friends, when Day entered immediately afterward the shooting began. Day and Thorn each fired several shots, but Thorn missed. Two bullets from Day's pistol entered Thorn's left breast and he fell to the floor.

Day ran out of the front door, pistol in hand, and went over to the Sikes Saddlery building, where he hid. E. M. Second, a crowd of Thorn's friends followed and many pistols were drawn. Day began shooting and emptied his revolver, but hit no one.

Day then retreated into the Sikes building and running upstairs secreted himself. He remained in hiding until Officers Subers and Ward arrived and placed him under arrest.


