OTHER LANDS THAN OURS.

It is reported that there is danger of an open rupture, with hostilities, between Sweden and Norway. The latter has for several years demanded greater independence in the way of foreign policy, and insisted upon separate diplomatic and consular services.

King Oscar II, who is a grandson of Napoleon III's marshal (Bernadotte), has steadily resisted this demand, which has been repeated by successive Stortingas, the Norwegian Diet. The liberals in Norway claim that the conservative ministry in 1884 destroyed guns and reduced the number of arms useless, and that a similar ministry took measures in 1893 against the independence of Norway.
