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THIRD BIG DAY AT BOSTON

Christian Endeavorers Continue to Hold Possession of the City.

DEBATES CREATING MUCH ENTHUSIASM

Crowds at the Three Great Day Meetings Continue to Be Large and Enthusiastic While the Programs Keep Up Their Interest.

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SEVERAL TOWNS BURNED OUT

Forest Fires in Michigan Are Again Assumed Alarming Proportions.

MUCH VALUABLE TIMBER CONSUMED

Rains Have Checked the Flames in Some Sections While in Others They Are Burning Unchecked—Ground Very Dry in Most Places.

DETROIT, July 12.—The telegraph companies report communication cut off to Traverse City, Charlevoix and other points in that region. Trains on all roads in that vicinity are badly delayed and in some cases are cut off. Nothing has been resolved here in response to inquiries sent to Thompsonville, where most of the residents of Benzie county yesterday lost their homes by fire had taken refuge.

The town of Cleary is also reported destroyed. Forest fires are raging along the line of the Grand Rapids & Indian railroad in Westford, Calkaska and Antrim counties, but a light shower in Mechanic City and vicinity last night is thought to have averted serious danger in that section. Odena, in Emmet county, was also reported in danger from fire, and at Mill Creek considerable timber was destroyed.

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
