

LAWN TENNIS IN OMAHA

Prospects for a Busy Season Among Local Players Seem Excellent.

ESTABLISHED AMONG WESTERN CENTERS

One Result of Last Year's Work Promises Well for the Summer—Activity Among the Several Clubs.

Omaha has an established reputation among Western cities as a lawn tennis center. This much, at least, may be claimed as the outcome of the efforts of the city club during last season. The Interstate tournament held in this city toward the end of the summer under the auspices of the National Lawn Tennis association is one of the fixtures of the year, which no western player will ignore in the future.

As a result from the achievement of this position, 1895 was not a very memorable one in local lawn tennis annals. There was considerable general improvement among the front rank men, but there were no notable successes in outside tournaments and no great increase in the interest manifested in the game by Omaha people. The greatest improvement was made in the doubles game. C. S. Cullingham and Roy Austin, in the latter part of the season, became a very strong combination, without doubt the strongest west of Chicago. C. H. Young and Caldwell were ordinarily successful, but they lacked the spirit of the game, and after another season's practice, should take rank as a very good second. Several other teams also showed considerable improvement toward the end of the summer, but it was late in the season before the doubles game was cultivated as it should have been.

Here is the ranking of the leading players of the city who took part in one or more of the tournaments held during the year. The classification being made, insofar as possible, by actual results: Roy Austin, C. S. Cullingham, C. H. Young, S. Caldwell, P. Haskell, E. H. Hart, W. Hamner, M. Hopkins, G. E. Doane, one time state champion and at present a member of the Omaha club, took part in the city tournament, but never regained anything like his former standing. Battin was a member of the club, but not a very active one, and Dennis was only out for the interstate tournament during the year. The list given is not in any sense complete and in several cases there is so little to choose between two or three men that it has been impossible to attempt anything more than a very rough classification.

For next season the Omaha club has adopted the cry of "greater popularity." It is the intention to double the membership and halve the membership dues. There is no reason to believe that the system of increase still in the membership, but the figure has been placed within easy reach, in order that there may be no doubt about its being reached. Another plan which has been settled at the annual meeting of the club, which is called for next Tuesday evening at the Hatcher's quarters. It is thought that it will be better to reduce the dues for \$5, or at the most, \$6, from each member. A reduction in the rent of the ground has been promised, and other expenses can be reduced. Another plan which is suggested, and which may have the effect of adding to the club's resources, is the admission of women to membership. Hitherto the privileges of the club have been extended to any women in the city who wished to avail themselves of them, but in practice the club has been a men's club. It is thought that if women are permitted to enter the club on the same conditions as men they will take more active part in the games and show a deeper interest in the game.

For officers of the club the names of Mr. Philip Crapo and Mr. R. R. Young have been suggested. Among the other clubs in the city the Shriner is undoubtedly the most active. It has organized for the coming year with fourteen members and is planning for a season of active work. The system of challenge competition is being perfected, which is expected to stimulate keen rivalry among the members and will probably have the effect of bringing out all the latent powers of the younger men in the club. The general outline of the scheme will be to rank the players in order of merit and any man will then be allowed to challenge the man next above him on the list under certain restrictions and regulations. The plan has worked well in many instances, some of the best conducted and most successful clubs in this country are in Chicago, and have been brought up to their present prominent positions by this means. More than one well known player in this country has also been brought up to the front by the introduction of this system awakened when he was a beginner.

The Thistle club was organized during the winter of last year. The Shriner membership is at present limited to four, but two good courts have been laid out on South Twenty-third street. The promoters are hoping to draw others into the organization before the season is well advanced. Up to the present the Young Men's Christian association club has not been organized, but it is safe to say that when the season for playing arrives the organization will not be wanting. Nothing has yet been done in regard to the holding of tournaments. No meeting of the state association has yet been held, but when the Omaha club has settled on the date for the city and interstate tournaments this can be arranged. There is much talk of holding the city and interstate tournaments together, but of course the wishes of the other cities in the state must be consulted before anything can be done. VIEWERS REGARDING NEW PARTY

Diverse Sentiment Regarding It in the Banks of Labor.

IS NOT GENERALLY COMMENDED

Statements of Its Promoters Not Accepted by Many and Others Think It an Ill-Timed Venture at Best.

With regard to the new party which recently had its inception at Labor Temple and which, because it has not yet been baptized, is called the labor party, there is a wide difference of opinion among laboring people. Among those who are opposed to it it is believed that at least the movement was exceedingly inopportune. They say it was launched without that diligent conference and careful consideration necessary to insure an effective political union of all the laboring forces and that neither time nor opportunity was given for a general expression of opinion as to what form the organization ought to take and the work it should seek to accomplish. The pledge requiring every member of the party to abjure completely and forever allegiance to any other party they say is much like slapping a man in the face who has already climbed half way up the fence to give assistance. A great many of those who talk in this way are not yet quite satisfied that through the popular party, for instance, the objects which labor organized and unorganized, is seeking cannot be reached.

As for the middle of the road populists, they look on the scheme as one that threatens without any exception the stability of the ranks of those striving for reform, and they will have nothing to do with it. They also impugn the motives of the men who are at the head of the movement, claiming that their intention is only to get a club large enough to serve them to some advantage in the attainment of personal ends and that no sincere attempt will be made to give to the new party more than a local character, for that will be sufficient for their purpose. And even in this it is insisted that the score of women can be employed at a score of men, and that the only escape from present conditions is through the new organization, which must be kept free from the domination of demagogues and the influence for purely selfish ends at the first good opportunity.
