What is Aimed at Described by President Wattles.

CHANCE FOR THE WEST TO SHOW ITSELF

Best Way to Attract Home-seekers to the Transmississippi Region—Benefits to Accrue to Omaha and Nebraska.

President Wattles of the Transmississippi and International exposition talked to the members of the Current Topic club of the exposition project last night at the Young Men's Christian association building.

In the beginning of his address he dwelt at some length upon the fitness of Omaha as the seat of the exposition. He said that from the time that the west was opened up first Omaha was looked upon as the gate city.

Mr. Wattles also touched upon the work that had already been accomplished. He said that last fall a company was incorporated and a small amount of capital was raised.

ON A LARGE SCALE. The originators of the exposition first calculated on an exhibit that would have been but little larger than a state fair.

During the years last past Mr. Wattles said that the financial depression, together with failures of crops, caused people to emigrate from the western country.

Mr. Wattles stated that the time the project was first really begun. It was calculated that \$2,000,000 would be spent on the grounds and buildings alone.

Moreover, Mr. Wattles stated that the city limit would be expanded. It would be sufficient to put every idle man in the city and nearly every woman.

The primary object of the exposition, however, was to advertise the west. Mr. Wattles announced, as such it was being encouraged by the state.

Salaries are Pared Down

Almost All School Board Employes Must Work for Less.

RULE OPERATIVE AT THE END OF THE YEAR

High School Teachers and Some Others Accepted of a Day for Five Grade and Kindergarten.

After fitting in various directions toward the common purpose of retrenchment the members of the Board of Education got together last night and agreed on a measure of economy which will effect reductions in the salaries of principals, teachers and janitors.

The plan was offered by Cramblet as an amendment to the rules. It provides that teachers without previous experience shall receive \$400 for the first year and \$50 additional for each additional year.

It is also provided for the kindergarten and first grade shall be to half day of school except at the Central, Park, Duane, Eckerman, Gibson, Sherman and West Side schools.

The amendments were accepted by the board and the principal in each case shall be reduced \$2.50 for each room so partially closed.
