Heavy Northwest Receipts Provokes Dull Trade and Prices. FOREIGN MARKETS FIRM AT THE OPENING. Provisions incline toward weakness in the wake of the improved tone displayed by the live stock quotations.

CHICAGO, Sept. 10.—Unexpectedly heavy northwest receipts and dullness of trade resulting more from a desire on the part of traders to wait for the government report caused December wheat to decline from 84 to 82. Corn was strong on its own account and closed a shade higher.

The heaviness of receipts of wheat in the northwest caused the market for that article to decline from 84 to 82. The decline was the result of the day before, Minnesota and Dakota received 1,042 cars, against 823 on the corresponding day of the year before.
