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TRAIN ROBBER BOUND OVER

Postoffice Officials Produce Evidence Against Him Which Seems Indisputable. TRUE TO ANSWER IN UNITED STATES COURT

James True, one of the two men who so boldly held up and robbed the mail cars on the Union Pacific's "Fast Mail" train near Utah station, Utah, last October, has been examined before a United States commissioner at Sacramento, Cal., and on the strength of the evidence there developed has been bound over to the next term of the United States district court.

The hearing developed the fact that True's description corresponded almost exactly to that given by the train hands and the express messengers of the man by whom they were intimidated.

True was introduced to prove that Mr. True, the wife, had endeavored to establish an alibi for her husband on the night of the robbery.

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DIES IN A CELL AT THE CITY JAIL

Excessive Use of Morphine Causes Mrs. Terrell's Death.

Mrs. Terrell, a city prisoner, died in one of the cells at the police station yesterday. The cause of the death is stated to have been heart failure, induced by the excessive use of morphine and intoxicants, to both of which the dead woman was addicted.
