

FORAKER AND ALLISON CLASH

Have an Altercation While Considering the Tariff Bill.
OHIO SENATOR CHARGES BAD FAITH
Change in the Wool Schedule of Tariff Bill the Cause of the Dispute.

WASHINGTON, June 22.—The wool schedule was taken up in the senate today. The first contest came on a motion to reduce the rate on first class wool from 11 cents to 10 cents a pound.

Mr. Foraker endeavored to smooth matters and mildly presented the suggestion of a compromise. He estimated a willingness to postpone the dispute rates, but with a strong temper said: "Senators are not to be driven and the senate is not a good place to drive."

Senator Allison's amendment, prescribing triple duties on a certain class of third-class wools, was agreed to, 29 to 26.
