

DESTITUTE SICK MUST WAIT

Dispute Between the City and County as to Responsibility Unsettled.

ADVISORY BOARD IN A PECK OF TROUBLE

Cases Where Suffering is Enhanced Because the City Cannot Help the Victims and the County Will Not.

The dexterity exhibited by the Board of Health in getting tangled up in various questions of municipal economy from which it never succeeded in extricating itself seems to have been inherited by its successor, the Advisory Board. The latter body spent over two hours yesterday afternoon in wrestling with one or two of these propositions and the result was a draw.

The controversy between the city and county physicians bobbed up again in connection with a report from Captain Haze of the police force, which had been submitted to Mayor Moore and was by him turned over to the board. Captain Haze reported the case of Gustave Anderson, who had been found sick in a hallway on North Nineteenth street and taken to the city jail in the patrol wagon. County Physician Blythin had promised that he would have him taken to the county hospital yesterday morning, but the man was not there without attendance in a cell in the jail. Another case was that of a man named Kelly at 1445 South Fourteenth street, who was very sick with paralysis. He had been visited by Dr. Blythin, but had been left alone since Monday. He was totally without attention and was lying in his filthy bed without food or medicine.

All the members of the board took part in the same old discussion that has been repeated at nearly every meeting of the board. By splitting hairs it was impossible to agree these patients to the hospitals, as there was no money in the health fund to pay for the patients. Chief Stewart declared that it was time that something was done in these cases, as they could not be left in the street or in a cell at the city jail.

The other members discussed ways and means of compelling the county physician to have the patients taken to the county hospital, and suggested bringing mandamus proceedings for that purpose. And then the matter ended exactly where it began, with the board split and no action taken.

The board spent over an hour in endeavoring to decide on some satisfactory plan for the purchase of supplies and stationery which were not included in any of the items submitted. Among the items were requisitioned for a lot of envelopes for the tax department, and one from the city treasurer for 100 copies of a bond circular which he wished to issue in connection with the proposed electric bond issue. It was finally decided that the secretary of the board should be instructed to obtain bills from not less than five job printing establishments for the work, and that there will be opened at a special meeting of the board at 2 o'clock this afternoon.

SCRAMBLE TO BUY CITY PAPER

Brokers Are Taking the Warrants at Par. There has been the liveliest demand for city warrants during the last day or two that has been experienced in several years. Reasons for Seeking Extra Janitor.

Constantian Schjerve of the city hall explains that the additional janitor, authorized by the city council Tuesday, is needed on account of the additional offices that have been opened during the summer. Three municipal court rooms and a room for the clerk of the court have been added and from now on the tax department will occupy all the remaining available space in the building. There were originally five janitors for the building, exclusive of the fifth floor, and the number has since been reduced to three. Plan for Draining Hamilton Street.

The Board of Public Works will put in a fifteen-inch pipe about 400 feet long to drain Hamilton street at its intersection with the Belt Line railroad. It was decided that the drainage mentioned was the most economical means of protecting the railroad property. The job will cost about \$200.

Flow of Water is Considerable Disappointment to the Interested Parties.

EXPOSITION ARTESIAN WELL A FAILURE

Shooting the Bottom of the Hole Falls to Materially Increase the Flow of Water at the Top of the Pipe.

As a source of supply for the lagoon, the artesian well on the exposition grounds is a failure. Such is the opinion of experts who have viewed the well since it has been "shot" and cleaned out. Persons who have seen the well and who are qualified to estimate, give the opinion that the flow is not over thirty gallons per minute or 45,000 gallons per day.

The rope was hauled up Tuesday afternoon and it was found that the water was quite dirty. This was attributed to a caving in of the earth below the iron casing which extends to a point about 800 feet below the surface. The well was cleaned out that night and was flowing uninterruptedly yesterday. The flow of water, however, is not as richly, but having an agreeable taste, the iron casing has yet to be extended to the bottom of the well and this may increase the flow somewhat, but is not expected to increase it materially.

There is some talk of shooting one of the upper layers of sandstone with the hope of thereby increasing the amount of water. Until this is determined it will not be extended any further down. There is also a suggestion to use an air lift for assailing the water to make it escape from the well. It is regarded as a doubtful proposition to increase the quantity of water several times, depending upon the depth to which the pipe carrying the compressed air is extended. It is proposed to pump water into the lagoon, to say nothing of the amount of water which would be required to fill the lagoon at its start.

Cemetery Associations at Law.

Trouble Over Old Dilemma's Breeds New Dispute. The time worn dispute between the Forest Lawn Cemetery association and the Prospect Hill Cemetery association has found its way into the courts again. These two associations have been enjoying themselves for the past seven years in disputing over their respective rights and claims in various phases of the question over which they have been in dispute. The latest step is that taken by the Forest Lawn association, which asks the court to find that the Prospect Hill cemetery belongs to the Forest Lawn association by virtue of a deed given by the late Byron Reed.

The purchase of land and the establishment of a cemetery are set up, and it is alleged that in 1890 the plaintiffs turned over to certain lot owners in Prospect Hill the care of the grounds, but did not convey any title to the ground. The plaintiffs claim that in 1890 Byron Reed died and his property was divided between his widow and two children. It is charged that the widow, through certain trustees, made a deed conveying to the Prospect Hill Cemetery association the land now known as Prospect Hill cemetery and sold lots for burial purposes, reserving the legal title, however, subject to the burial rights granted to purchasers. It is alleged that the Forest Lawn association was incorporated in May, 1885, and that Reed decided to place the Prospect Hill cemetery, subject to the burial rights thereto granted. It is alleged, in this connection, that one condition of the transfer was that the city was to have claim on the land for park purposes in case it was not sold or used for cemetery purposes.
