

PROMISES TO BE A BIG SHOW

Good Weather Now the Only Qualification Demanded by the Board.

SUCCESS OF THE STATE FAIR IS ASSURED

Indications Are that Nebraska's Annual Agricultural Exposition Will Be Better and Greater Than Ever Before.

The State fair, which will be held in this city next week, promises to be the best exhibition of the kind that the people of this state have ever had an opportunity of feasting their eyes upon.

With the entries that have already been received Secretary Furnas is authority for the statement that there will not be any vacant space in the buildings.

The number of exhibitors who are sending in applications for space is also considerably large. Public notice of these has been made from day to day and another big addition is expected.

The Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific railroad announced to Secretary Furnas that it would have an extensive exhibit of all the products of the country and the city.
