AGRICULTURAL EXPERTS MEET

American Association of Farmers' Institute Managers in Session at the Exposition Grounds.

Yesterday morning about seven members of the American Association of Farmers' Institute Managers met for their first annual meeting at the Commercial club.

The afternoon meeting was held in Superintendent Taylor's office in the Horticultural building at the exposition. It proved an important one. Though but two conventions of the association have ever been held already has discord entered its ranks. Different states throughout the country that have been asked to join have declined. They claim the association is merely a corporation and that its scope and constitution are too narrow to be of national benefit.

After some discussion they decided to change the time for holding the annual convention. Scarcely six voting members are present, the others being detained by their state fairs or university work. Such their state fairs or university work. Such their state fairs or university work.

One of the most serious difficulties encountered by the institute is the lack of funds. Superintendent McKerrow moved the members to increase the number. Secretary Taylor said that \$200 at least was needed yearly. President Dye thought the institute was too small and that the public should be interested in the work.

Dr. D. Denise, the president of the State Board of Agriculture of New Jersey, one of the institute's guests pledged New Jersey's support, provided the meetings were broadened. At the suggestion of Prof. Smith the program for the day was taken up. Prof. Smith of Michigan spoke for a few moments on the "Value of One Day Institutes." He said that in Michigan the plan for holding these institutes had been tried most successfully. At twenty-two state fairs the result was that one must be of special interest to catch the public and that unless the \$1 members were allowed to vote they would not attend the meetings.
