Iowa Farmers Meet at Ames. AMES, Ia., Oct. 7.—(Special.)—About 500 Iowans, principally farmers, visited the Iowa Agricultural college in this city Tuesday and listened to interesting addresses by R. C. Barrett, state superintendent of public instruction; Henry Wallace, Judge Leeda, Director Henry of the state experiment station of Wisconsin and dean of the department of agriculture in the University of Wisconsin; Governor Shaw and Judge Klacik of the State Board of Control were unable to be present.
