PEDAGOGICAL SCHOOL PROPOSED, CHICAGO

Instructional Statistics of Illiteracy in Foreign Countries—School for Cash-Boys—General Educational News.

Mrs. Emmons Blaine of Chicago, daughter of Cyrus H. McCormick and daughter-in-law of James G. Blaine, is maturing plans for the establishment of a pedagogical school for the education of home children.

Colonel Francis W. Parker, present principal of the Cook County Normal school at Normal Park, will be the head of the college and he will be given wide powers for carrying out his educational ideas.

Mrs. Blaine has had this idea in mind since 1893. It is her purpose to accomplish a practical good for the poor, whose condition and advancement have formed one of the studies of her life in recent years.

Mrs. Blaine's liberality in educational matters was shown by a donation one year ago of \$25,000 to the Teachers' college of the University of Chicago.

Statistics of illiteracy are sought in continental nations of Europe in the case of soldiers recruited for service in the army. Among German recruits, reports the New York Sun, the percentage of illiteracy is 11. Of 1,000 recruits 889 can read and write, 111 cannot.

According to the last figures of those signing marriage certificates in Scotland the ratio of illiteracy among them was only 25 per 1,000. In England it was 58 and in Ireland it was 170; but since then, of course, the general diffusion of education has further reduced the figures, making them approximately those of Germany and other countries of the continent.

School for Cash-Boys.

A unique duty of the cashboys in Wauwanesa's New York establishment is to go to school every morning from 8 to 10. A portion of them, numbering about thirty, assemble in a cheerful and commodious room in the basement, relates Leslie's Weekly, and devote themselves to arithmetic, spelling, grammar, writing, composition and other rudiments of an education.

The 180 boys are divided into classes and each class has two sessions a week. Regular attendance and strict attention to study are as much insisted upon as care in an work about the establishment. SHOT THE MANEATER DEAD.

Experience of a French Explorer in an African Jungle.

The French explorer, M. Edouard Pele, the author of the volume "From Cape to Lake Nyassa," is now publishing an account of his exploits as a lion and elephant hunter, which the French papers are printing copiously. The following is his story of a lion chase in Tsholiro:

"Two natives came to me, sent by the chief of a neighboring village. They told me that a lion had carried away an old woman and that he was still prowling around the neighborhood. We set out immediately and after a march of four hours we arrived at the village. Night was coming on and it was impossible to do anything in the darkness. The best plan was to wait for daylight. A little distance from this habitation there was another village, where the natives were dancing to the music of tom-toms. At 4:30 in the morning I heard shrieks and cries in the little village, and just as I got out with my gun in hand, followed by my men, a weeping woman threw herself at my feet, wringing her hands and explaining that a lion had carried away her son.

"By torchlight we found our way to the other village, and, on inquiring, we learned that the lion had carried away the boy just as he opened the door of the hut to fetch some firewood that was at the threshold. The cries uttered by the people in the village frightened the lion away, and, moreover, it was impossible to find any trace of him with the torchlights. Daylight soon appeared. I told the natives not to come in any great numbers to the village, leading toward the river, going along with his burden in front of more than twenty huts. The inhabitants had not been aroused by the woman's cries until after the beast had passed. Still following the track, we reached the stream, where the animal halted and advanced without changing his course. At the same moment he lashed his tail, lowered his ears and seemed about to charge. Having followed him with my gun, I aimed at the nape of his neck and killed him. His legs bent as if they were rubber, and he rolled over dead as a log.

"We found the trail behind the house, which proved that the brute had gone around it. With the trail there were footmarks of the child. Evidently he had been seized by the upper part of the body. Then we found a few drops of blood. The animal passed through one of the streets—if I may call them streets—of the village, leading toward the river, going along with his burden in front of more than twenty huts. The inhabitants had not been aroused by the woman's cries until after the beast had passed. Still following the track, we reached the stream, where the animal halted and advanced without changing his course. At the same moment he lashed his tail, lowered his ears and seemed about to charge. Having followed him with my gun, I aimed at the nape of his neck and killed him. His legs bent as if they were rubber, and he rolled over dead as a log.

"Before following the trail any further I sent Tambarika to watch the outer edge of the thick bushes and so find if there were any traces of the animal having passed through. A well known whistle from him told me that such was the case, so I took to the clearing in order to get to him as quickly as possible. Experience of a French Explorer in an African Jungle.

The French explorer, M. Edouard Pele, the author of the volume "From Cape to Lake Nyassa," is now publishing an account of his exploits as a lion and elephant hunter, which the French papers are printing copiously. The following is his story of a lion chase in Tsholiro:

"Two natives came to me, sent by the chief of a neighboring village. They told me that a lion had carried away an old woman and that he was still prowling around the neighborhood. We set out immediately and after a march of four hours we arrived at the village. Night was coming on and it was impossible to do anything in the darkness. The best plan was to wait for daylight.
