

NEW DEVELOPMENTS ARISE

Prospect That Differential War is Not Yet Nearing Termination.

FURTHER REDUCTIONS ARE REPORTED

Railroads Make Haste Cutting Rates—Fretting That When Minimum is Reached the Fight Will Continue.

KANSAS CITY, Mo., Sept. 16.—The war over Kansas City-Omaha differentials to the southeast has resulted in another cut in the rate on packing house products. The Burlington has given notice of a cut to 5 cents per 100 pounds from Omaha to Ohio river points. The Memphis rail will today cut its rate to 3 cents from Kansas City to Memphis. The Missouri Pacific, having tired of doing business for less than the cost of transportation, has given notice that its tariffs will be restored to the rate prevalent before the rate cutting began.

No notice of the information contained in the foregoing dispatch had been received by officials of the Burlington road yesterday morning, and while it is admitted that such further reductions as noted above may be made the amount has not yet been determined. The Burlington officials here have not as yet received official information of the fifth cut of the Memphis, but, nevertheless, it is an undisputed fact that its fifth reduction becomes operative September 17. This being the case and knowledge of it existing in Kansas City, it is presumed that the Burlington officials there have taken the bull by the horns and announced a sixth reduction, to become operative immediately. The sixth reduction will bring the Burlington's rate on packing house products to the Ohio river from Omaha 40 to 5 cents, whereas it was formerly 22 cents, and on consignments to Memphis, figured on the proportional basis, to 9 cents instead of the original tariff of 27 cents. If, as stated in the Kansas City dispatch, the Memphis line has decided upon a sixth reduction, bringing the rate from Kansas City to Memphis down to 3 cents, it has only one further move to make, and that will be to wipe out the rate entirely, hauling the freight absolutely free. Then the Burlington will reduce its rate from Omaha to Memphis to 3 cents and the differential from that which it has been fighting will be in force.

It was admitted that this may be the result of the fight, instead of a cessation of hostilities, as was generally predicted earlier in the week. If the rate is cut down to 3 cents from Omaha, it will be joining game for both railroads and the fight will then be as to which road can stand the low longer time. The Burlington has on its fighting clothes and is just as determined to win out in the fight as was when the controversy began. It is true that it has not received the support from Omaha which it had expected. This is conceded by interested outsiders who have followed the fight closely, and while the Burlington needs this lack of support, it is not complaining, but is fighting for the principle of the thing and do not propose to lie down to the Memphis line. When the rate is lowered to 3 cents from Omaha and the Memphis line is carrying freight from Kansas City free, it will be driving right there, and it is believed that the Memphis line will soon, in the parlance of the school boy gladiator, "holer enough."

At Missouri Pacific headquarters no notice had been received of its withdrawal from the arena in the differential fight and General Agent Phillippi was not disposed to place any credence in the report, stating that information would assuredly have been received here, the point of interest, before it would have been given out authoritatively to the press.
