Mrs. Merschheim is not an attractive woman. She is nicely dressed, however, and appears to be of a nervous disposition. She explained that Arriens made great professions of love for her and once when she asked her if she loved him, she says she replied that she thought she did. While this sensational story was falling from the lips of the witness Arriens sat within the railing as calmly as though he were not involved. By his side Mrs. Arriens. She listened eagerly for every word of the testimony and the frowns that clearly on her face showed that she did not believe the allegations against her husband. Mrs. Merschheim was subjected to rigorous cross-examination and it was at the close of the day when she was excused from the witness stand. He was there at the instance of Merschheim's attorneys, and although he made the other side obtain whatever money they can from the defendant, this specific charge is made in Arriens' answer on file in the district court. Husband Charged with Pouring Gasoline in Bath Tub and Lighting It. In many particulars the divorce suit of Anna L. Walker against Harry Walker, filed in the district court Friday afternoon, is one of the most unique documents on record. The Walkers were married in Council Bluffs November, 1882, and soon afterward moved to Omaha, taking a house at 1712 Douglas street. The first allegation is that the defendant indulged in liquor to excess and became an habitual drunkard. When Walker was erratic and original in his methods, if the petition states the case correctly, Mrs. Walker declares that on the morning of January 15 of the present year, about 2 o'clock, the defendant came to his Douglas street home and emptied a large gasoline can into the bath tub. His next movement was to apply a match. The fire that resulted not only severely frightened the household, but aroused the neighbors, so the petition states. On other occasions, it is alleged, that Walker amused himself by knocking coal oil lamps off of the dining tables and otherwise toying with fire. Mrs. Walker asks for absolute divorce, financial relief and custody of her children. Court Notes.
