MAY BE BOMBARDMENT OF LADYSMITH

Reinforcements from Durban Arrive at Estcourt and Pietermaritzburg.

BIG FORCE OF BOERS LEAVES PRETORIA

Accompanied by Contingent of German Artillery with Quick-Firing Guns.

NARROW ESCAPE OF DURBAN VOLUNTEERS

Many Uniforms Are Pierced by Bullets in the Escape of Hard.

ESTCOURT, Natal, Monday, Nov. 6.

The Natal Artillery left camp today, escorted by troops of the Imperial Light Horse, Carbineers and Natal police.

Firing was heard this morning in the direction of Colenso from which it is believed the Boers have returned the bombardment of Ladysmith.

COLSENSBURG, Nov. 6.—It is reported that 2,000 Boers have left Pretoria and are going to protect the southern border of the Orange Free State.

LONDON, Nov. 8.—To the eyes of military experts the darkest page of the war is now being written.

Several transports with 4,000 troops were expected to be in Capetown harbor by this time.

Of course, it is possible that dispatch boats have been sent to meet troop ships with instructions to proceed to Ladysmith.

The reported departure of a Boer contingent from Pretoria with German artillery gunners moving in a southerly direction is taken to mean co-operation in the northern part of Cape Colony.

TRANSPORT ST. PAUL IN PORT

Military Prison on Luzon Is So Crowded that Many Offenders Evade Court-Martial.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 8.—The transport St. Paul has reached this port after a rough passage of twenty-one days from Nagasaki. It had but eleven passengers, including several discharged soldiers.

The transport Indiana, with the Tennessee regiment aboard, was at Nagasaki when the St. Paul sailed. Besides the Tennessee regiment it had over 100 prisoners aboard.

Most of these are on Luzon, so crowded that many prisoners escape court-martial, as there is no place to confine them.

The St. Paul left Manila it was understood that each transport would bring from fifty to one hundred to Alcatraz. Most of the men are charged with minor offenses, though three are accused of assaulting an officer and one of desertion.

The United States cattle transport Wyfield has arrived from Manila. Its voyage was uneventful.

LOOTING DONE BY FILIPINOS

Private Gregory of Thirteenth Minnesota Takes No Stock in Charge Against Funston.

MINNEAPOLIS, Nov. 8.—(Special Telegram.)—Private Gregory of the Thirteenth Minnesota and interpreter, who were sent to Manila, say the looting of the churches in the Philippines was done by the Filipinos themselves and by the thirty Chinamen. One wealthy Chinese merchant showed him a big chest filled to the brim with sacred utensils.

He takes no stock in the charge of the Monitor newspaper against General Funston, who had, he says, the reputation of being the strictest of all the regimental commanders in his orders against looting.

After landing in Malolos he stationed a guard in every building of importance.

CHANGE IN MANILA PRESS CENSOR.

Major Thompson of the Signal Corps Relieved from the Position.

BELL OCCUPIES MABALACAT

Ordered Out to Reconnoiter He Successfully Locates the Enemy.

SEVERAL INSURGENT OFFICERS ARE KILLED

Two Companies of Insurgents Are Driven Out and MacArthur's Line is Now Extended in Front of Angeles.

MANILA, Nov. 8.—5:55 p. m.—General MacArthur has occupied Mabalacat. His entire line, including the Twelfth, Seventeenth and Nineteenth infantry and part of the Fourth cavalry, is extended three miles in front of Angeles in a good tactical position. Major Bell took Mabalacat, being ordered to reconnoiter yesterday until he located the enemy, he pushed into the town, driving out two companies of insurgents and killing several Filipino officers. The Americans suffered no loss.

SERIOUS RIOT AT ATLANTA

Results Over Arrest of Gamblers at the Institution of Anti-Saloon League People.

SPRINGFIELD, Ill., Nov. 8.—A serious riot occurred at Atlanta, Ill., yesterday as a result of the arrest of gamblers there at the instigation of the Anti-Saloon League.

The riot broke out in the afternoon, when the police arrested a number of gamblers. They were fined \$100 and costs each. After the trial the gamblers gathered a force of about 200 thugs and went to Sutherland's hotel and assaulted him.

Officers destined for Atlanta, who had just returned from Springfield, were taken to Sutherland's and were beaten into a state of insensibility. Sutherland escaped and took refuge in a cornfield. The thugs pursued him on horseback, but by walking to Lincoln, Ill., and boarding a train bound for Springfield, Sutherland eluded them. Many arrests will follow.

MAKE AN ADVANCE IN WAGES

Paddlers Receive Increase of Fifty Cents Per Ton, Highest Price Paid Since 1880.

YOUNGSTOWN, O., Nov. 8.—At a wage conference today between James H. Nutt, president of the Iron Manufacturers' Association and a committee representing the Amalgamated Association of Iron and Steel Workers, the wage scale for November and December was discussed. The scale was raised by one cent and interpreted to mean that the price of paddy will be \$5.50, an increase of 50 cents per ton. This is the highest price paid for paddy since 1880.

STRIKE LIKELY AT CHEYENNE

Five Hundred Workmen in the Union Pacific Shops Threaten to Walk Out.

CHEYENNE, Nov. 8.—(Special Telegram.)—A strike of the Union Pacific shop force here, numbering over 500 men, is threatened tonight. The machinists and boiler-makers, who are paid 32 cents per hour, held a meeting tonight and made a request for an increase to 35 cents per hour. Superintendent of Motive Power McConnell, who is here, referred the request to President Burt and pending an answer the force of machinists quit work. An answer to the demand of the men is expected tomorrow morning. It is feared that if the increase is not granted a strike will follow.

Veteran Wittke Guilty of Murder.
