

BESSEY ON THE UNIVERSITY

Acting Chancellor Presents a Report to Board of Regents. INSTITUTION IS IN A GOOD CONDITION

Total Number of Registrations for the Year Will Be Over Two Thousand—Plans for the Future.

LINCOLN, Dec. 13.—(Special.)—In his report to the Board of Regents, Acting Chancellor Bessey treats of the ultimate removal of the state university from its present site in the city to the state farm and suggests to the board that it would be well to begin planning for such changes.
