Federation of Labor Outlines Political Action for Local Unions.

EFFORT TO SETTLE PAINTER TROUBLE

Convention Takes Unanimous Action Toward Settling the Dispute Between the Local Painters' National Organizations.

DETROIT, Mich., Dec. 15.—A resolution recommending members of labor bodies to use their election ballot independently of the predominant political parties was adopted this afternoon by the American Federation of Labor after first eliminating a declaration of suspicion against labor men who might advocate the interests of the present political parties.

Considerable of the time of the afternoon session, which was the only one held today, was occupied by the discussion of a movement to more clearly define the working status of the respective crafts in order to avoid conflicts between the organizations whose working in the respective callings is more or less allied and interwoven.

The resolution for independent political action, as amended in committee and adopted, read as follows:

Whereas, The various reports submitted to our trade union officials are in effect that so far our efforts by petitions and interviews with the respective state and federal government are concerned, little has been accomplished by the above mentioned method, and a general labor law is passed, it is either declared unconstitutional by the courts or allowed to remain unenforced, a declaration on the statute books.
