TRUANTS MUST GO TO SCHOOL. Secretary Gillan Makes Comparison of Rolls with Census Which Betrays the Delinquent Ones.

Secretary Gillan, of the Board of Education, is on the trail of truants. At the meeting of the board Tuesday he was empowered to employ clerical assistance at an expense not exceeding \$40 for the purpose of comparing the school rolls with the school census.

Those whose names appear on the school census and not on the rolls will be notified that the time has almost expired in which they can attend school for twelve weeks as required by law.

A peculiar difference exists between the child labor law and the compulsory education law framed by the last legislature. The former provides that a child cannot be employed by any proprietor unless twenty-one weeks have been annually devoted to study.
