M'COMAS FACTION WINS IN MARYLAND

New Jersey Men Do Not Consider Resolution to Support Secretary Long for Vice President as Binding Upon them.

PHILADELPHIA, June 19.—The contest for national committee in the Maryland delegation resulted today in the election of Senator McComas over Mayor Miller of Baltimore, by a score of 11 to 5.

The Utah delegation is deadlocked in the selection of a national committee, and it appears more likely that the disagreement will be carried to the national committee for settlement.

The Kansas delegation met this evening and decided unanimously to support Roosevelt for vice president.

The Colorado delegation will meet tomorrow morning and resolve to vote for Governor Roosevelt for vice president.

California is for Long

After two days of uncertainty the California delegation today decided to support Secretary Long for vice president.

The question of transferring the vote from one to the other without nominating the man they wish to defeat is the difficult problem.

"If we can't do it, then we haven't got control of the convention," said Senator Hanna. "If the friends of the president cannot agree upon a candidate and by their differences cause the nomination of a man that is not wanted and does not want the place, they will have to take the responsibility for it."

The conferences between Senator Hanna and Senator Platt were an interesting

feature of the vice presidential contest. Hanna talked to Platt as he had talked to Odell and Quigg the day before.

The contest has not assumed any such definite form as to even approximate the relative strength of the three candidates for the vote for the others in view of developments.

Where Woodruff Stands

Lieutenant Governor Woodruff then said: "If I thought I could be nominated by this convention I certainly would encourage the sentiment which my friend from Brooklyn has expressed."

Kansas for Roosevelt

The Kansas delegation determined to vote for Roosevelt and told him so Wisconsin is another state which seems to be determined to vote for Roosevelt.

It was rumored that today a message had been received from the president saying that the convention must remain untrammelled and that the administration must not be brought into the matter in any way.

NEW YORK NAMES WOODRUFF

Roosevelt Says He Does Not Want Vice Presidency, but Would Not Decline

PHILADELPHIA, June 19.—The New York delegation was called to order at 10:15 by Chauncey M. Depew, the chairman.

Lieutenant Governor Woodruff was the first speaker. He said: "I have from the beginning of the consideration of this subject occupied one position and that was that if at any time it should be apparent to the convention that the nomination of Governor Roosevelt would be in line against him."

Mr. Lusterbach finished by saying, after a passionate appeal to Roosevelt to take the nomination: "I don't think we ought to select any candidate, but simply let the convention have its way and Governor Roosevelt, not declining, will be nominated."

Chairman Depew said the question before the body was Mr. Wald's motion to make Woodruff the candidate.
