

TRIBUTE TO KING HUMBERT

Impressive Memorial at Washington in Honor of Late Monarch.

ATTENDED BY THE HIGHEST OFFICIALS

Church is Elaborately Decorated and Uniforms of the Different Nations Lead a Brilliant Coloring to Solemnity of the Occasion.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—Amid scenes of impressive solemnity and in the presence of the president of the United States, members of the cabinet, officers of the army and navy, the ambassadors and ministers of foreign countries and a great concourse of people from all lands, the memorial service for the late King Humbert I. of Italy was held at St. Matthew's Catholic church at 11 o'clock today.

The church had been decorated elaborately for the occasion. Around the sanctuary and on all sides rose a mass of palms and foliage plants, while the beautiful white marble altar stood out from a forest of tall and graceful palms.

I beg to state that at a meeting of the council of the Eighth International Congress of Navigation held today I asked them to bear in mind when considering the time and place for future meetings that the government of the United States made an appropriation for a world's exposition to be held in St. Louis in 1904.
