



### SHARE FOR COUNTY FATHERS

Suburban Railway Promoters Offer to Divide Their Profits.

### COMMISSIONERS CONSIDER NEW PROPOSAL

Company Asks Leave to Lay Tracks Along Either Side of Road Without Interfering with Established Grade.

The promoters of the proposed Omaha & Fremont Electric railroad have offered a new and valuable concession to the county commissioners as an extra inducement to secure the desired long-time franchise for their company. It is a promise of 10 per cent of the net earnings of the road after the capital stock pays a dividend of 4 per cent. The commissioners believe that this arrangement ought to be worth about \$5,000 a year to them, enough to keep the road-way used by teams between the two cities in good repair always.

### CAREER OF A DEAD CASHIER

Neola Bank Endeavors to Hold Broker Responsible for Irregularity of Its Official.

At the session of court yesterday before Judge Shabough, two important depositions were introduced in the case of Herman Mandel against James B. Boyd & Co. Both were by John C. Watts, the former cashier of the State Bank of Neola, Ia., whose defalcation is the basis of the suit. One, which was offered by the defense, went to show that Watts had turned over to the bank all the funds he received from Boyd & Co. during a period when he was trading in grain on the Board of Trade. The other, by the prosecution, was in substantiation of the allegation that Boyd & Co. knew Watts was using bank funds in his speculations, and for that reason are liable to his bondsmen for the losses.

These depositions bear directly on the contentions of the litigants on each side. It has been shown without dispute that in 1896 John C. Watts conducted a series of trades in grain through Boyd & Co. and another firm in Chicago, using in the transactions about \$21,125 of the Neola bank's money. This sum is represented by nine ten drafts on the Chemical National bank of New York by the State Bank of Neola. Watts, as cashier, having signed them. A shortage in Watts' accounts was discovered in the fall of 1896. Prior to that time he had won on some of his tradings, reducing the shortage from the total amount of money used to \$18,560. This sum his bondsmen, Herman Mandel and C. D. Dillon, paid.

Watts died a few months after the defalcation became known. One of the bondsmen—Dillon—is no longer living. Mandel, the other man who was security for the young cashier, brought suit against Boyd & Co. to recover the amount of the shortage, alleging that this firm was aware Watts was using the bank's funds, a circumstance that would make the members liable for the losses.

### GORDON IS DENIED A NEW TRIAL

Counsel Thereupon Serves Notice of Appeal to Supreme Court.

Judge Dickerson has overruled a motion by Judge Gordon's attorneys for a new trial in the impeachment proceedings. The judgment ousting the former police magistrate from office was entered yesterday. A motion for a new trial was immediately entered, with the result mentioned. In ruling on the motion Judge Dickerson said he will allow the attorneys forty days in which to prepare and serve a bill of exceptions. The counsel notified the court that a transcript is being prepared with the intention of filing it in the supreme court at once in the attempt to force a hearing in the case at the next sitting of the court.
