FIGURES ARE MADE TO FIT

Fusionists Force Returns to Correspond with Their Ambition. STRANGE COURT IN SOUTH OMAHA WARD

When Clerks Are Unable to Make Figures Tally They Accept Result Favoring Fusionists—Hearing Postponed Until Thursday.

Positive evidence of irregularity on the part of certain election clerks and judges was revealed at yesterday's hearing of the contest proceedings wherein Judge P. Schuler, Sheriff J. Coleman, and Messrs. Young and Carsten Rohrer, republicans, seek to prove their right to the legislative seats for which John Liddell, Frank T. Ransom, Cary M. Hunt and Charles T. Johnson, fusionists, hold certificates.

Checks Take Liberties.

Fred M. Young, one of the contestants, was the principal witness of the forenoon. Mr. Young's testimony related particularly to the count in the First precinct of the Third ward in South Omaha. In substance, Mr. Young said he watched the count in the aforesaid precinct and that he saw frequently when the clerks could not make their counts tally they simply agreed upon whatever figure they presented to the board of election officers.

Recount the Only Remedy.

Mr. Young said after he had taken notice of so much irregularity in the counting of the ballots, he demanded a recount and reasonable in writing. He thought it put his demand upon the board. His demand was peremptory. If such work was perpetrated in one precinct in South Omaha, the same conditions might prevail elsewhere. When asked if he saw any republican ballots rejected, he said he observed a few such instances, but could not state how many.

Other Candidates Testify.

A. J. Coleman and Carsten Rohrer were called to the witness stand, but their testimony was not introduced as simply one to establish a record and lay the proper foundation for the proceedings. They will be called, however, later in the hearing, at which time they will give additional testimony.

Meyer Injured in Collision

Two Street Cars Crash Together and Passenger on Rear Platform is Hurled to Ground. Julius Meyer, general agent of the Provident Savings Life Assurance Society of New York, with offices in the Bee building, was seriously injured at 10:45 o'clock Sunday evening as the result of a collision between two street cars at Sixteenth and Dodge streets.
