Omaha Determined to Have 1902 Live Stock Meeting.

ENERGETIC EFFORT TO LAND THE PRIZE

Local Delegates to Salt Lake Meeting Have Engaged Headquarters and Will Make a Brisk Hustle.

Omaha is going after the next year's convention of the National Live Stock association in winning style. There will be over 200 Nebraska delegates in the meeting of the association at Salt Lake City week after next, and every one of them will put forth his best efforts to secure the 1902 convention for Omaha.

The National live stock association is one of the most important organizations of this country, and its annual meetings are usually attended by about 7,000 people from all parts of the United States.

The association was formed at Denver four years ago and met in the same city the following year. Last year the convention was at Fort Worth, Tex., and this year's meeting will occur at Salt Lake City January 15 to 18.

Nebraska will have not less than 200 hunters at the Salt Lake convention," said M. A. Daugherty of Sidney. "We feel confident of our ability to bring next year's meeting to Omaha. Aside from the fact that Omaha is a most accessible point for all the members, that it is one of the greatest live stock markets on the continent and that the next auditorium can be offered as a superior place for holding the sessions, we have another important claim upon next year's convention. We Nebraska people helped to start the meeting of last year at Fort Worth and were instrumental in securing this year's convention for Salt Lake City, and we are therefore in a favorable position to land reciprocity at this time."

Omaha's Headquarters. "We have engaged four big parlors on the first floor of the New Kenyon hotel for Nebraska headquarters at the Salt Lake gathering and we will keep open house there and impress the warmth of Nebraska hospitality upon all the delegates. Our invitation to come to Omaha next year will be extended to the association in no half-hearted way and we believe it will be accepted. Kansas City, St. Joseph and Chicago will contest with us for the next convention, but we have the inside track."

George H. Payne, who will be on the Omaha delegation to the Salt Lake convention, said in going to New York tonight, but will hurry back in order to join the party that will go from here to attend the live stock convention at Salt Lake City. I think every business man of Omaha who can possibly get away ought to go out to Salt Lake to be in the work of securing next year's meeting of the stockmen for this city. Omaha ought to have this convention, not only because it will bring thousands of visitors into the city for a week or two, but because it will attract attention to our city as a country to our superior advantages as a live stock center."

P. E. Sanborn, another member of the delegation to Salt Lake City, said: "We will have the auditorium built this year and in order to enjoy the full benefits of it we must bring to Omaha all of the big conventions that we possibly can. I think the live stock convention is particularly desirable to this city, on account of our immense interest in that industry. We will go to Salt Lake with a determination to secure the convention and will offer the convention many inducements to meet here next year. It will do Omaha a great deal of good to entertain the thousands of influential men who come from all parts of the country to attend the meetings of the live stock convention, and our invitation to them ought to and will be extended most heartily."
