

DEATH TO RIVALRY IN LOVE

James Maloney is Murdered by Pugilist, Who Then Commits Suicide.

BROTHER OF JOHN MALONEY OF OMAHA

Tragedy Enacted in Manila, Where the American Prize Fighter Had Accumulated a Fortune After South African Adventures.

CHICAGO, Jan. 12.—(Special Telegram.)—News of the murder in Manila of James Maloney, a well known and wealthy Chicago sporting man and traveler, by an Australian prize fighter, who then committed suicide, was received here tonight. Rivalry for the affection of a woman prompted the deed of the pugilist.

Maloney left the city in 1897 and with his brother John of Omaha and several friends went to the gold fields in South Africa. The tragedy was enacted in December, according to a letter received from Thomas Gaynor, who was a friend of the dead man. Maloney and the Australian met in Calcutta and resolved to go to Manila.

ESTIMATES VARY WIDELY

Appraiser Values Personal Property of Late Ogden Goebel at \$2,000,000 While Family Says \$100,000.

NEW YORK, Jan. 12.—The report of the appraiser appointed by the surrogate to establish the valuation of Ogden Goebel's personal property was made public today and shows that it was worth nearly \$2,000,000 instead of being a trifle over \$400,000, the estimate furnished by the family. The items of the report show that he held shares in the Commercial National bank worth \$760,000 and over \$150,000 interest in the Gallatin National bank, Union Trust company, Pennsylvania Coal company and a number of railroads.
