ators at the same time instead of electing one first and the other afterward and taking chances on electing a second one at all. In an open ballot the advantage lies also in holding a brake on the fusionists should they attempt to jump in. If the roll were called first for one senator and again for the second it is easily conceivable that the fusion members might jump in at the tail end and leave the republicans hanging in the air. The simultaneous ballot worked so well today that the alleged objections previously urged have been badly punctured.

After holding two sessions the joint rules committee appointed yesterday at the conference of republican members tonight reported that it was unable to agree on caucus caucuses. A vote of five to four the committee favored a double ballot, but there was a still wider division on the number that should be required to rule in the caucus, the various propositions ranging from forty-three to sixty. The result of the deliberations was reported to the caucus tonight and the committee retired, pending further consideration of plans by that body.

Committee is Discharged.

After hearing its report the republican caucus discharged the rules committee and adjourned without fixing a date for another meeting. Messrs. Laffin and Mockett asked to be relieved from further service on the committee, but the other members expressed a desire for more time to present a final report. The caucus thought there was but little likelihood of the committee ever arriving at an agreement, and consequently relieved all of the members. No other business or matters were discussed at the caucus.

About 200 citizens of Lincoln met at the Capital hotel tonight and passed resolutions endorsing the candidacy of D. E. Thompson, a copy of which was presented to the latter by a committee headed by I. M. Raymond and W. D. Fitzgerald.
