PINK COAT'S FANCY FLAHS

It Gives Him a Spare Half Length in the Wheeler Handicap. TERMINUS THIRD AND WADDELL FOURTH

Recent Derby Winner Falls to Fit in Near the Front-Time Position Ever Before.

CHICAGO, July 20.—With mighty strides the pink coat took the lead in the last furlong post in today's Wheeler handicap, and holding his advantage he secured a spare half length from the heavily-weighted Advance Guard. The Conqueror II was a close third, being only a neck behind the second horse.

The feature of the final day's sport at Washington park quite came up to expectation, and a fascinating and surprising crowd of 15,000 spectators with good sport. Fourteen horses started, but three were scratched—Sidney Lucas, Favonius and Martinus. George Arnold, carrying 111 pounds, was added, so that a field of twelve was on the post.

Five to one was offered against any horse in the race at almost all times in the betting. John Bright finally settled down as the slight favorite.

They were at the post but a few minutes and then broke away to a good start. The Lady was taken clearly by the lead, followed by Robert Waddell, the two being near the inside rail. George Arnold crossed across from the extreme outside position and took third place. Pink Coat and John Bright were the last to leave the post, but Terminus was at once pulled back to last place by little Advance Guard.

The Lady was out in front to stay as long as she could and Dominick evidently was determined not to lose his advantageous position next to her. Accordingly the pace was fast almost from the outset. The post in front at the start kept in the lead, closely attended by George Arnold, second, Unknown and Vesuvius, with the entire field well bunched behind.

Then from out of the straggling bunch behind the tall form of Pink Coat came with mighty lunges, gaining at every stride. This horse was moving faster and more strongly than any other horse in the race, and a furlong from home the result as to the first place was a foregone conclusion.

Pink Coat moved surly into the lead and Dupee was able to take him slightly to hand and look over his shoulder to see what the others were doing. Advance Guard was now making his last effort, but to no avail. He came with much of his usual determination in the race, and gradually overtook and passed the conqueror II, who hung on well, but was not able to catch Pink Coat, who won by a good half length.

Behind the Conqueror II the horses floundered as follows: Vesuvius, who floundered, Gormley waited too long to get into a length in front of Robert Waddell; he a length before Star Chamber and Vesuvius, who finished head and head; then a gap of three lengths before the trailers. The Lady, John Bright, Lady Elite, The Unknown and George Arnold, in that order, were the pointings race from start to finish and was never prominent. It is supposed his bad legs affected him.

The time was 2:04 1/2, a new record not only for the Washington Park track, but for the Wheeler handicap, a former record for both being 2:04 1/2. Pink Coat's property of Woodford & Buckner and won the American Derby in 1898. Last year, carrying one pound less than he did today, he was beaten a nose for the Wheeler handicap by the Roman. His betting price at that time was 10 to 1.
