

GENERAL BATES IN CHARGE

New Commander of the Department of the Missouri Reaches Omaha.

FORMAL TRANSFER OF AUTHORITY

General Merriam of Denver Steps Out and General Bates Takes His Place—Back Among His Old Friends and Co-Workers.

General John C. Bates arrived in Omaha yesterday and for the first time since the outbreak of the Spanish war the department of the Missouri has a resident commander permanently in charge of the department.

General Bates arrived at 11:30 o'clock. He was met at the depot by General Cowin, whose services in the staff of the general in the Philippines, and by Major Michie, acting adjutant general, and Captain Erwin, inspector general.

Transfer is Made. While this reception was in progress the orders transferring the command from General Merriam to General Bates were being prepared.

General Bates was accompanied to Omaha by his aide and so far has not announced the selection of any. The general staff offices are nearly all filled at this time, there being but few places at this office recently ordered here as chief surgeon of the department during the absence of Colonel Kimball.
