Several thousand people are expected to visit the city during the next month and the municipal authorities are anxious to have it look its best. With this end in view the streets and alleys everywhere have been cleaned.

LABOR INSPECTOR COMPLIMENTS EMPLOYERS OF CITY.

"Conditions in the factories of Council Bluffs are excellent, and in fact no better conditions exist anywhere in the state," said Alfred Shepherd, deputy state labor commissioner and state factory inspector, yesterday.

Speaking of his work here Mr. Shepherd said: "I have never found any disposition to ignore or evade the laws for the protection of employes in factories in the western part of the state, but the same, unfortunately, cannot be said of the eastern part of Iowa, especially in towns along the Mississippi river."

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
