Grand Island Road Argues to the Board Assessment is High

(From a Staff Correspondent.) LINCOLN, May 13.—(Special.)—The State Board of Assessment was in session a short time this morning, taking up the hearing of the St. Joseph and Grand Island railroad for a reduction in its assessment.

W. N. Purvis, tax commissioner for the road, talked to the board and offered arguments why the assessment should be cut down from the 1912 amount. The report shows that the earnings per mile last year show a deficit of \$67, while in the year before the deficit was \$100.

Following the lines brought out by other roads yesterday Mr. Purvis said that other property in the state was not assessed as high as railroad property.
