

BERKOWITZ ASKS MORE HELP

City License Inspector Wants Police to Give Him Assistance.

Would Have Officers Observe Whenever a Vacant Store Becomes Occupied and Report to Him Accordingly.

If a plan, about to be urged on the commissioners, is adopted, policemen will, in the future, be compelled to report on each occasion when a vacant store building is again occupied.

Dave Berkowitz, city license inspector, has been handicapped in his work by a lack of assistance, and as a result, since there are no deputies in the office, he often does not make an inspection in time to compel any itinerant vendor to pay his license tax.

The Associated Retailers of Omaha have been greatly interested in the passage of the ordinance affecting itinerant vendors, and they are likewise becoming active in the enforcement of the ordinance.

The retailers have been considering some action in the matter, and one of the prominent members has expressed the opinion that the council will be asked to require policemen in each section of the business district if the city to report to the license inspector when a vacant store building is occupied...

Anti-Saloonists Active to Enforce the Gibson Law

The Gibson law, and the ruling recently made on it by the state supreme court to the effect that saloons shall not be operated in buildings owned by brewing companies, is giving every county clerk in Nebraska a little extra work to look up the ownership of the buildings in which saloons are being operated in his county.

The Nebraska Anti-Saloon League has called loudly for this information. The clerks are setting it and submitting it to the league headquarters at Lincoln.

The data is being gathered particularly in regard to the saloon buildings owned by the Storz Brewing company, or the holding companies, which the supreme court found to be practically identical with this brewing company.

About one-third of the counties of the state have already made their report to the league. Of these half have reported saloon buildings owned by the Storz Brewery company, according to information coming from the league itself.

The league proposes to protest the granting of licenses to these places when the time comes for the renewal of the licenses. Some of the licenses expire about April 1.

Union Label Fraud Traced to Howell Rouses Some Ire

"It's a downright deliberate fraud. It shows so, right on its face." It was a union printer who was speaking while pointing to the union label on the picture postal gotten out and distributed by R. B. Howell to impress voters with his desires in the election.

The purpose of blaming the label on the campaign document is to appeal especially to the members of the labor unions, but the discovery of the fake, evidently used in a nonunion shop, is eliciting outbursts of resentment and may cause an investigation by the union.

ADJOINING STORES ARE VISITED BY THIEVES

The Omaha Harness company store, 319 South Thirteenth street, was entered by thieves Monday night, who gained entrance by cutting a panel from the rear door. A gold watch and leather chain, together with leather cuffs and watch holster, was taken away.

The store of Frank W. Mochra, 323 South Thirteenth street, immediately next door, was also visited by the prowlers, who entered this establishment by removing the putty from the glass surrounding a window pane, which they took out and deposited carefully on the inside.
